3 AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE DANE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES,
4 REGARDING THE NAME AND MEMBERSHIP
5 OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL
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7 The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Dane does ordain as follows:

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9 ARTICLE 1. Unless otherwise expressly stated herein, all references to section
10 and chapter numbers are to those of the Dane County Code of Ordinances.

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12 ARTICLE 2. Section 15.46(1) is amended to read as follows:

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14 **15.46 CRIMINAL COMMUNITY JUSTICE COUNCIL.**

15 (1) Composition.

16 (a) The Criminal Community Justice Council shall consist of six voting
17 members:

- 18 1. the county executive;
- 19 2. the county board chair;
- 20 3. the sheriff;
- 21 4. the district attorney;
- 22 5. the presiding judge of the circuit court;
- 23 6. the clerk of courts;
- 24 7. three persons from diverse backgrounds who have lived experiences of
25 incarceration or have been directly impacted by the criminal justice system, and
26 are selected from a list of recommendations submitted by relevant community
27 organizations including but not limited to Nehemiah, JustDane, MOSES, EXPO,
28 FREE, Focused Interpretation, and Centro Hispano to the Public Protection and
29 Judiciary Committee and Health and Human Needs Committee at a joint meeting;
- 30 8. two persons with behavioral health expertise selected from a list of
31 recommendations submitted by relevant community organizations including but
32 not limited to Recovery Coalition, NAMI, Homeless Services Consortium and
33 Chrysalis to the Public Protection and Judiciary Committee and Health and Human
34 Needs Committee at a joint meeting.

35 (b) ~~There shall be six~~ The following are non-voting members of the Criminal
36 Community Justice Council:

- 37 1. a representative of the Office of the Public Defender, appointed by the State
38 Public Defender; of the state public defender's office;
- 39 2. the City of Madison chief of police or designee;
- 40 3. a police chief from a jurisdiction outside the City of Madison appointed by
41 the Dane County Police Chief's Association;
- 42 4. a representative of the Wisconsin Department of Corrections appointed by
43 the Secretary of the ~~Wisconsin~~ Department of Corrections;
- 44 5. a representative of Dane County municipal judges appointed by the
45 presiding municipal judge of District 5;

46 **6.** a representative of the Public Protection and Judiciary Committee,
47 appointed by the committee chair.

48 7. the Mayor of the City of Madison, or their designee

49 8. a representative of the Health and Human Needs committee appointed by
50 the committee chair.

51 **(c)** Non-voting members will not be counted for purposes of establishing a
52 quorum.

53 (d) The Community Justice Council shall permit any member of the county
54 board of supervisors to take part in its deliberations and to speak on any agenda
55 item. This includes closed sessions except if the individual supervisor's exclusion
56 is necessary for the purpose of the closed session. Nevertheless, county board of
57 supervisors who are not members of the Community Justice Council shall not vote,
58 shall not be counted in determining whether or not there is a quorum, and may not
59 make or second any motion.

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61 ARTICLE 3. Section 15.46(3) is amended to read as follows:

62 **(3)** Duties. The Council shall:

63 **(a)** Provide an on-going forum for collaboration and coordinated leadership
64 among criminal justice agencies.

65 **(b)** Facilitate the implementation of effective, data-driven criminal justice
66 policies and practices that maximize justice and the safety of the public.

67 **(c)** Monitor and ensure accountability of the criminal justice system.

68 **(d)** Provide program oversight for certain criminal justice initiatives.

69 (e) Establish a subcommittee structure as follows to address specific issues
70 and report to the Community Justice Council:

71 1. Racial Disparities Subcommittee

72 a. Composition:

73 i. District Attorney or their designee, to serve as co-chair;

74 ii. County Board Chair or their designee, to serve as co-chair;

75 iii. Presiding Judge of the Dane County Circuit Court or their designee to serve
76 as co-chair;

77 iv. the Sheriff or their designee;

78 v. the Madison Police Department Chief of Police or their designee;

79 vi. a representative of the Office of the Public Defender, appointed by the State
80 Public Defender;

81 vii. the Office for Equity and Inclusion Director;

82 viii. the Juvenile Court Administrator;

83 ix. the Youth Justice Manager

84 x. the Dane County Department of Human Services Community Programs
85 Manager;

86 xi. two persons from diverse backgrounds who have lived experiences of
87 incarceration or have been directly impacted by the criminal justice system
88 selected from a list of applicants and appointed by the chair of the Community
89 Justice Council.

90 b. Duties. The subcommittee shall 1) research local and national best
91 practices to identify criminal justice system approaches to decrease and eliminate

92 disparities, including making recommendations about current programs to
93 decrease criminal justice system involvement; 2) use data to analyze racial equity
94 gaps throughout the criminal justice system and set benchmarks for reductions; 3)
95 lead inclusive engagement of communities most impacted by the criminal justice
96 system; 4) report quarterly to the Community Justice Council

97 2. Pretrial Services Subcommittee

98 a. Composition:

99 i. District Attorney or their designee,

100 ii. the Clerk of Courts or their designee;

101 iii. the Presiding Judge of the Dane County Circuit Court or their designee;

102 iv. the Sheriff or their designee;

103 v. the County Executive or their designee;

104 vi. a representative of the Office of the Public Defender, appointed by the State
105 Public Defender;

106 vii. a representative of the Wisconsin Department of Corrections appointed by
107 the Secretary of the Department of Corrections

108 viii. the director of the Office of Pretrial Services

109 ix. the Criminal Justice Council Coordinator;

110 x. two persons from diverse backgrounds who have lived experiences of
111 incarceration or have been directly impacted by the criminal justice system
112 selected from a list of applicants and appointed by the chair of the Community
113 Justice Council;

114 b. Duties: The subcommittee shall 1) identify approaches to lowering the
115 pretrial population; 2) analyze court appearance rates and publish findings; 3)
116 investigate local and national best practices regarding peer supports and
117 community engagement at pretrial; 4) report quarterly to the Community Justice
118 Council.

119 3. Behavioral Health Subcommittee

120 a. Composition:

121 i. District Attorney or their designee,

122 ii. the Director of the Department of Human Services or their designee;

123 iii. the Presiding Judge of the Dane County Circuit Court or their designee;

124 iv. the Sheriff or their designee;

125 v. the Madison Police Department Chief of Police or their designee;

126 vi. a representative of the Office of the Public Defender, appointed by the State
127 Public Defender;

128 vii. a representative of the Wisconsin Department of Corrections appointed by
129 the Secretary of the Department of Corrections

130 viii. the Chief of Chiefs of Police or their designee;

131 ix. the Corporation Counsel or their designee;

132 x. the director of NAMI Dane County, or their designee

133 xi. one additional public member with behavioral health expertise selected
134 from a list of applicants and appointed by the chair of the Community Justice
135 Council.;

136 b. Duties: The subcommittee shall 1) review the intersection of behavioral
137 health and criminal justice including data analysis; 2) investigate local and national

138 best practice in the crisis continuum of care; 3) analyze data and set goals for
139 reduction of criminal legal involvement; 4) report quarterly to the Community
140 Justice Council.

141 (f) Section 15.04(2) shall not apply to the subcommittees set forth in sub (3)(e).
142 (g) all public members of the subcommittees listed in sub(3)(e) shall serve 2
143 year terms and may receive per diems and mileage per section 15.04(7)(a).

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145 *[EXPLANATION: This amendment renames the Criminal Justice Council to the*
146 *Community Justice Council, expands its membership, and delineates the*
147 *composition and duties of three (3) subcommittees including two (2) public*
148 *members for each subcommittee, and provides mileage and per diems for such*
149 *public members.]*
