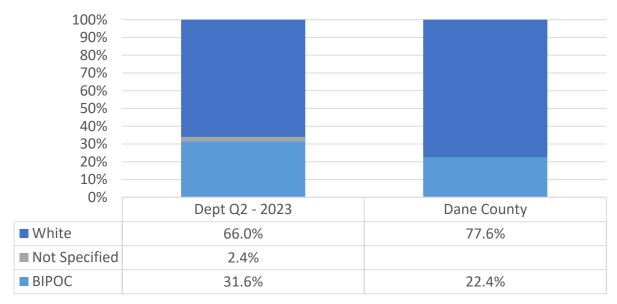






Almost 32% of our staff identify as a race or ethnicity other than White

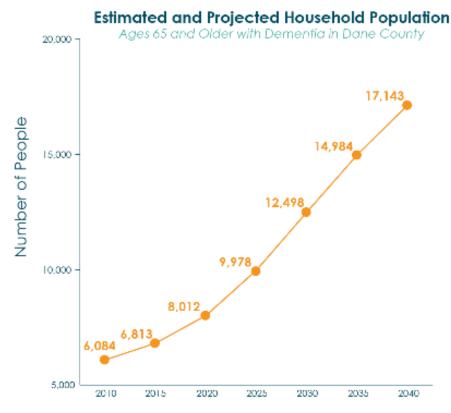

Programmatic Highlights

- Add support for our increasing aging population
 - Transportation Office (half time)
 - Account Clerk II
 - 3 Case Managers
 - Social Worker
 - Dementia Care Specialist (half time)
 - IT funding





Case Managers and Social Workers

Title	Average # Days job open	Average # Hits	Average # of Applicants	Average # Qualified Applicants
Social Worker (n=2)	79	1,515	6	5
Case Manager (n=3)	16	1,827	46	31

Department employed 192 people across several social work classifications and 14 people in case manager classified positions, for a total of 206 people. The racial/ethnic diversity continues to be significantly different (18.75% of social work staff indicating they are BIPOC, 57.1% of case manager staff report they are BIPOC).



2024 Budget Overview

Programmatic Highlights

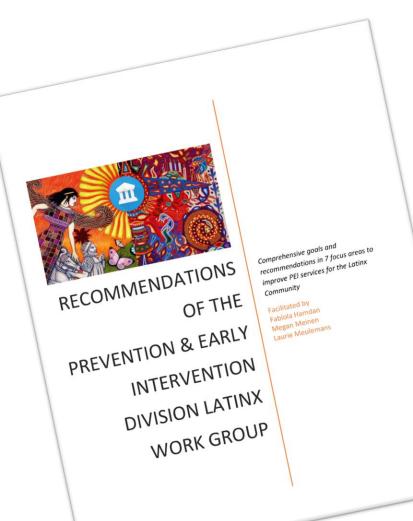
- Increase support at the Job Center for bilingual clients, including bilingual positions: .5 FTE Clerk I-II, and 1 FTE Economic Support Specialist
- Add community support, including a JFF Social Work Supervisor for increasing demand on our community-based social work teams, and 1 FTE bilingual Social Service Specialist in Immigration Affairs.
- The call volume at the BHRC continues to increase, and we are looking to add 2
 FTE Peer Support Specialists.



2024 Budget Overview

Programmatic Highlights

- Add an Accountant Clerk II, Accountant, Communications Coordinator to keep pace with the increased contracting requirements and DCDHS footprint expansion, as well as reach more of our community and inform them of access to our services
- Invest almost \$400,000 in Badger Prairie Health Care Center to ensure that our residents can continue to navigate the community and caretakers can continue to help residents move through their living space with ease.



Language Access Overview

- 2020 Work group to evaluate language access in Division of Prevention and Early Intervention
- 2021 Work group authors recommendations
- Work group expands, completes department evaluation of Federal Programs for Language Access Compliance, writes recommendations
 - Language Access Coordinator position created and funded
- 2023 Language Access Coordinator hired



Language Access Moving Forward in DCDHS

- 1. Address immediate needs first
- 2. In a modular approach, build Language Access Plan
- 3. Support Language Access Coordinator
- 4. Create training and educational resources for staff, and partners
- 5. Implement
- 6. Evaluate



Language Access Challenges/Opportunities

- 1. No blueprint within the county
- 2. Specialized nature of our work
- 3. Constantly fluctuating demands
- 4. Increased costs for translation/interpretation
- 5. Creating access for all types of communications
- 6. Diversity of communities
