under Wis. Stat. s. 5.15, the commission shall present to the county board an

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- (d) Following the public hearing, the commission shall consider any amendments to the plan, approve a final plan, and submit the plan to the county board. The commission shall also submit a statement signed by at least four members of the commission certifying that the criteria set forth in sub (5) have been applied in the order in which they are listed and that such criteria have been implemented, in such order, to the maximum extent practicable.
- (e) Within 60 days after every municipality in the county adjusts its wards under Wis. Stat. s. 5.15, the county board shall adopt a final supervisory plan in accordance with Wis. Stat. s. 59.10(3)(b)2.
- (f) If the plan proposed by the commission is rejected by the county board or if the board fails to take action to adopt the map, the commission may submit an amended plan to the county board, and the county board may consider the revised plan. If no plan is approved in the time required by Sec. 59.10(3)(b), a court may determine the final map, as required by state and federal law.
- (g) Upon adoption of a plan, the chairperson of the board and county staff shall take all steps necessary to effectuate the redistricting, including filing a certified copy with the secretary of state.
- (6) The commission shall develop a map that divides the county into the number of districts determined by the county board. In the preparation of its plan for dividing the county into districts for the election of county board supervisors, the commission shall apply applicable state and federal law, which shall control in the event of any conflict with this ordinance. The commission shall also apply the criteria set forth in the following paragraphs to the maximum extent practicable. The following paragraphs shall be applied and given priority in the order in which they are listed.
- (a) Each district should represent the same population size, in accordance with the U.S. Constitution and state statutory requirements that districts be substantially equal in population. If difference in population are necessary to complete the maps, any such differences in population must be justified by the other criteria set forth in this section.
- (b) Such districting plan shall be established in a manner that ensures the fair and effective representation of the diverse ethnic and racial populations in Dane County which are protected by the Federal Voting Rights Act.
- (c) District lines shall keep intact neighborhoods and communities with established ties of common interest and association, whether historical, racial, economic, ethnic, religious or other.
- (d) Each district shall be contiguous and compact and shall be no more than twice as long as it is wide.
- (e) The map shall minimize the number of municipal boundaries crossed in each of the county districts.

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
