1 2	REFERENDUM ON INCREASEING THE MINIMUM WAGE IN WISCONSIN
3	The current minimum wage in Wisconsin is \$7.25/ hour. With that wage, a full-time
4	worker with a 40-hour a week job earns \$15,080 a year.
5	worker with a 10 hour a week job carns \$13,000 a year.
6	On that salary, a resident of Dane County cannot afford the basic fundamental needs of
7	housing and food. According to a 2014 report by the National Low Income Housing
8	Coalition, a 1-bedroom apartment in Dane County, one must earn \$14.27/hour, double
9	the state's hourly minimum wage amount.
10	
11	Dane County has serious racial disparity issues. Individuals working minimum wages
12	jobs in Dane County are disproportionately minority. According to the Race to Equity –
13	Racial Disparities in Dane County Report, released in October of 2013 by the Wisconsin
14	Council on Children and Families, 54% of African American Dane County residents earn
15	poverty wages or less, compared to 8.7% of white. African American children in Dane
16	County are 13 times more likely to be growing up in a family in poverty than while
17	children.
18	
19	The United States is experiencing an unprecedented rise in income inequality between its
20	highest paid and minimum wage workers. According to the Pew Research Center,
21	America's current income inequality is the highest it has been since the 1920s, just before
22	and during the great depression. The top 10% of Americans earn 80% of the national
23	wealth. The top 1% earns 24% of the wealth. The average CEO in America earns 380
24	times more than the average worker, let alone a minimum wage worker.
25	
26	Dane County, Wisconsin, and the United States will not recover from the current
27	economic downturn if full time workers do not earn enough money to survive—to feed
28	and house themselves, their children and their families.
29 30	The Center for Economic and Policy Research has found that an increase in the minimum
31	wage does not decrease the number of available jobs or negatively impact on the
32	economy and the number of jobs available. Instead, it increases job productivity and
33	decreases work turnover.

35	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following referendum question be
36	placed on the November 2014 ballot:
