## Intent/Justification

The proposed budget includes \$60,000 for monitoring equipment which contributes to knowledge of lake/watershed systems, including climate, water level, and river discharges. This amendment increases expenditures and borrowing to fund the construction of a buoy for monitoring of water quality on Lake Monona. A similar buoy is already in place on Lake Mendota. The capital equipment expense would be covered by the county, while the Clean Water Alliance would pay for maintenance and operating expenses. The research stemming from the data provided by the monitoring buoy will provide new insights into how different lakes respond to wather extremes and climate shifts. The additional data will allow Dane County to better track the response of the lake to policies and actions to reduce phosphorus and will provide information to help engage the public in lake use and lake improvement efforts.

#### Intent/Justification

Substantial resources must be set aside to spark affordable housing development, shelter capacity expansion, and housing co-located with supportive services. This funding may be combined with multiple layers of state, federal, municipal, and private financing, when possible, to create the largest number of units. WHEDA low income housing tax credits, CDBG, HOME, and Section 8 rent assistance could be layered to increase the affordability of new housing units. Innovative, lower cost projects, including, but not limited to scattered site, micro-home, cooperative, and sustainable living communities should also be solicited. Eligible projects may also address existing needs in our homeless services system, including, but not limited to a comprehensive day resource center, a wet shelter, space for persons banned from other shelters, gender neutral spaces, and additional space for single women, families with children, and couples without children. The Departments of Administration, Economic and Workforce Development, Planning and Development, and Human Services shall put together a work team to prioritize housing and homeless needs in consultation with the Homeless Issues Committee, Human Services Board & Health and Human Needs. The work team shall issue and evaluate response to Requests for Proposals. No funds shall be expended or borrowed without Health and Human Needs and County Board approval. At least 30% of the funds shall be used for housing outside of the City of Madison.

Kurt Paulsen, PhD, AICP, UW Associate Professor of Urban and Regional Planning, recently prepared the Affordable Housing Needs Assessment, Dane County and Municipalities, for the Dane County Departments of Planning and Development and Human Services. The Assessment concludes Dane County needs to create approximately 1000 affordable housing units per year for the next 26 years to meet our needs. Dane County Resolution 292, 2011-2012, Dane County Recognizes Housing as a Human Right, resolved to reduce the number of homeless school kids by 50%, create 100 single room occupancy (SRO) units and 100 units affordable to persons supporting themselves on SSI or W-2 by September 1, 2015, ensure no one is denied access from shelter, and providing additional daytime shelter space in the downtown area. The County has not devoted sufficient resources to meet these benchmarks or the larger, long term affordable housing needs of our residents.

Solutions to homelessness target significant racial disparities and housing barriers for the elderly and disabled. Approximately 80% of homeless persons served in (and turned away from) shelters in Dane County are African-American or multiracial, according to the July 30, 2014 point in time count. The Aging and Disability Resource Center continues to report affordable housing as the top unmet need, by a significant margin, identified by their clients. Lastly, numerous studies across the nation indicate that providing housing to the homeless saves money on higher cost expenditures including psychiatric hospitalization, incarceration, alternate care, and law enforcement and emergency room services.
