AAA Legislative /Advocacy Committee Amendment to 2015-2017 Dane County Legislative Agenda

Amend Human Services section, <u>Services to Older Adults</u>, the Physically Disabled and <u>Mentally III</u>, page 5, line 222:

Item 8), <u>Employment Services for Older Adults</u>, by adding the words "and county" after the word "state". The amendment would read as follows:

8) <u>Employment Services for Older Adults:</u> Extend the use of state <u>and county</u> funds to encourage the business community and technical colleges to create and support retraining and placement of older adults entering/re-entering employment, especially those lacking English proficiency.

Youth Commission Amendment

Amend page 1, line 36, item 4 by adding:

4) <u>Apprenticeship/Internships</u>: Encourage Provide incentives for the business community and technical college system to create and support apprenticeship/internship opportunities to unemployed post-high school young adults. Expedite entry and graduation from the programs to meet increasing demands to fill vacancies created by an aging boomer workforce.

(Unanimously adopted by the Dane County Youth Commission 11/6/14)

Create new items (Health and Human Needs)

Add new item 22, page 4, line172:

22) <u>Legalize Marijuana</u>: Enacted a referendum for Spring 2014 Election ballot, "Should the state government enact legislation legalizing marijuana?" Dane County voters approved by 64.5% yes votes and 35.5% no votes.

Add new item 8, page 4, line 198:

8) <u>Drug Testing</u>: Oppose legislation that would enact drug testing as a requirement for public benefits.

Add new item 3, page 4, line 205:

3) <u>Comprehensive Community Services (CCS)</u>: Support continued full funding of the State match.

Add new item 8, page 5, line 273:

8) <u>Mass Transit for Disabled Veterans</u>: Support fully funding bus passes and other mass transit costs for all service-connected disabled veterans in all Wisconsin locations and transit programs.

Add new item 48, page 10, line 525:

48) <u>Nonpartisan Redistricting</u>: Enacted a referendum for Spring 2014 Election ballot, "Should the Wisconsin Constitution be amended to require a nonpartisan system for redistricting legislative and congressional districts in the state?" Dane County voters approved by 82.1% yes votes and 17.9% no votes.

Amend agenda items (Health & Human Needs)

Amend page 2, item 23, line 96 by adding:

23) <u>Landlord Regulation</u>: Repeal 2011 WI Act 108, which prohibits local government ordinances that place limits or requirements on landlords (Fair Housing Ordinance). Repeal 2011 WI Act 143, which prohibits a local government from imposing a moratorium on eviction actions and amends/creates new provisions that benefit landlords including but not limited to allowing: landlord discretion in disposing/storing of medical/personal items; landlords to withhold a tenant's security deposit or portion of for damages, unpaid rent/utility bills; and severability of rental agreements. Repeal 2011-2012 budget bill provision which deletes landlord foreclosure notice. <u>Repeal 2013 WI</u> Act 76 (Prohibit Local Landlord Ordinances)

Amend page 2, line 105 by transferring item 7 from page 4, line 94:

7) <u>Medicaid Expansion Funding</u>: Enacted referendum question for 11/4/14 ballot, "Shall Governor & Legislature accept available federal funds for BadgerCare to ensure that thousands of Wisconsin citizens have access to quality and affordable health coverage?" Dane County voters approved this item in 11/4/14 general election with 81.7% yes votes and 18.3% no votes.

Amend page 5, item 10, line 226 by adding:

10) <u>Dementia Patient Rights</u>: Oppose **2013 AB 575 which imposes legislation to impose** new guardianship requirements, involuntary psychotropic drug administration and emergency detention requirements in Chapters 51 and 55.

Amend page 10, item 43, line 514 by adding:

43) Oppose Milwaukee County Board Reform: Oppose legislation which that impedes the Milwaukee a County Board from governing, budgeting and hiring staff through referendum and state law without county input.

Check out status, page 10, item 38, line 505:

38) <u>Palermo's Worker Union</u>: Support the Palermo Workers Union, endorse the consumer boycott campaign and urge UW Madison to support the boycott.

Check out percentages, page 8, item 1, line 411:

1) <u>Shared Revenue</u>: Support additional funding for the County Mandate Relief Fund; allow counties to be credited for 100% (now 85%) of local purpose revenues. Oppose elimination of Small Municipalities Shared Revenue program. Support a county expenditure restraint program; and oppose the imposition of cost controls on counties.

- Wisconsin 2030 State Rail Plan. Support funding and planning for intercity rail serving Dane County and Madison and urge WIDOT to work with Minnesot5a DOT on Milwaukee-Twin Cities High Speed Rail Study.

Miscellaneous legislative/rules items:

- <u>Clean energy choice.</u> <u>Support legislation to increase</u> <u>affordability/sustainability of renewable energy in Wisconsin.</u>

- <u>Renewable energy</u>. Oppose legislation that restricts or prevents waste-toenergy and

- Takings Legislation. Oppose legislation that requires county government to compensate real property owners for restricted use or loss of property value as a result of law or regulations.

- Mercury Projects ban. Ban the sale of mercury-containing products, with the exemption of dental fillings and fluorescent lamps. - <u>Mercury Rules.</u> Support changes to mercury rules to achieve a 90% reduction per DNR rule.
- Boating Laws. Support legislation making fines and associated penalties for drunken boating commensurate with those for drunk driving.

- Divestment of Fossil Fuels. Support zero investments in fossil fuel companies for Dane County, all local governments and state institutions.

Oppose construction of four lanes on Main Street (State Highway 19) in Waunakee. Support an update of the 2003 North Mendota Parkway traffic study and request WIDOT to consider how the proposed Parkway, State Highway 19,

- Power Plants. Support efforts to clean up dirty power plants.
