ACCEPTING REVENUE FROM THE WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES AUTHORIZING NEW POSITIONS FOR COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY SERVICES (CCS) DCDHS - CYF DIVISION

Policy Analysis Statement:

Brief Description of Proposal -

Dane County Department of Human Services (DCDHS) has been certified to provide Comprehensive Community Services since July 1, 2015. Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) is a Medicaid Mental Health Recovery Benefit that is available to children, youth and adults who are Medicaid eligible, and pass a required functional screen. CCS certification requires that each County have a CCS Administrator and a CCS Service Director. The State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) expectation for Comprehensive Community Services programs in large counties like Dane is to have at least one full time Service Director position. Continued CCS certification requires increased resource allocation with 1 FTE dedicated as the CCS Service Director.

Current Policy or Practice -

Budget and professional service contract changes require County Board approval.

Impact of Adopting Proposal -

This resolution seeks to add a second 1 FTE Project Social Work Position to provide intake and annual recertification services for children and youth, and 1 FTE Project Mental Health Specialist/CCS Service Director Position. Both positions will be allocated to the Department's Children Youth and Families Division. These positions will be fully funded by CCS. Dane County must recertify clients annually in order to continue CCS services. The current child/youth intake staffing cannot meet demands for both intake and recertification requirements. The Service Director position is required for continued CCS certification. Funding this position is required in order to continue to provide CCS services.
