Long-time DCYA researcher and stakeholder Dr. Dorothy Espelage is now with the University of Florida. She will continue to use the DCYA data in her research. It was suggested she present by lecture hall telecommunication. Tally Moses at UW Madison social work may be interested in presenting her research findings. The YC will include an update on DCYA activity to its HHN presentation in July and request a full County Board presentation. Maniaci suggested an update also be provided to the City Council Information Committee.

E. Reports to Committee

- 1. Research templates submitted to date (Bettin): Two research summaries have been received to date. The committee decided to archive these for internal tracking purposes, but not post on the web site given the summary nature of the documents.
- 2. Update on Wiggio cloud communication system (Bettin): Members of the DCYA school committee were oriented to Wiggio and invited to join. The platform was well received. DCYA 2015 administrative documents have been uploaded. The platform will be used to manage and plan the 2018 DCYA survey.

- 3. Updates on 2015 data analysis efforts
- Mental/Emotional Health Analysis (Koenig): Koenig prepared a preliminary analysis identifying factors impacting students who report high levels of anxiety compared to the general Dane County student population. Lafferty will follow-up with Koenig on next steps in this analysis. DCDHS analysis has not begun.
- Reproductive Health (Benson): Nikki Smith will meet with Benson to focus on analysis of reproductive health issues during her internship.
- Public Health efforts using DCYA (Olsen): Analysis done for Waunakee AODA
 Coalition comparing a number of factors, including alcohol use, to the general Dane
 County student population. PHMDC will be doing issue briefs using DCYA and other
 data sources on alcohol use, suicide prevention, tobacco (use and environmental
 scan) and sexual/reproductive health.
- How schools are using the data (Bettin): Nine school districts responded to a survey on how districts are using the 2015 DCYA data to inform curriculum and policy decisions. See attachment.
