APPROVING THE ADDITION OF VILLAGE OF MAZOMANIE TO THE DANE COUNTY URBAN COUNTY CONSORTIUM

# Policy Analysis Statement:

Brief Description of Proposal -

The Urban County Consortium (UCC) allows Dane County to receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Home Investment Partnership (HOME) funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Participating communities sign three-year Cooperation Agreements that automatically renew for each three period that Dane County qualifies for entitlement status as an Urban County. Current qualification period is FY 2017-2019.

Authorizing new units of local government to the Urban County Consortium requires County Board approval.

# Impact of Adopting Proposal -

The Village of Mazomanie adds 1,667 in population to the Urban County Consortium bringing the total participating to 94% of the eligible Dane County population outside the City of Madison. A higher participation rate of eligible units of local government in the UCC allows for a more comprehensive approach for the CDBG program because Dane County CDBG and HOME dollars can only be spent in participating communities.

## Narrative/Assumptions about long range fiscal effect:

There are no implications for the County tax levy in expending CDBG or HOME funds in Mazomanie provided they are expended according to HUD guidelines. HUD requires that entitlement grantees expend federal grants in a timely fashion at the risk of losing future allocations due to unspent money. Higher participation in the UCC gives the County more opportunities to solicit proposals for expending CDBG and HOME funds.
