G. Reports to Committee

UPDATE FROM DIRECTOR OF OFFICE FOR EQUITY AND INCLUSION ON OEI BUDGET AND ACTIVITIES

Office for Equity and Inclusion (OEI) Director Wes Sparkman gave the committee an update on progress and answered committee member questions. The OEI submitted its 2017 budget to the County Executive and it included reallocating funds to have a full-time clerk for 2017. The funds were allocated from underspent funds elsewhere. They maintained the 2016 positions and line items. They are also reallocating funds for a second digital directory kiosk on the CCB first floor (there will be 2).

They are moving closer to having a full staff in the OEI and are recruiting for the new contract compliance office position. They also hope to see their new office space completed soon.

The Advisory Board had its first meeting and will have another meeting in December if not sooner. They made progress on the Partners In Equity (PIE) grant committee selection and hope to make a first award before the end of the year.

The new recruitment specialist, Carrie Braxton, reports that OEI and the County Board are receiving positive feedback in the community re: these new efforts.

On September 1 the County Executive will meet with department heads to discuss department equity action workplans.

Committee questions:

What is OEI doing with the \$6000 + in the budget for equity initiatives? Sparkman said they are carrying it over and that they foresee using it for supporting festivals, etc. For implicit bias training of employees they will need to secure additional funding as the \$6000 will not be sufficient for that. Chair Corrigan reminded Sparkman that there is a provision in the enabling resolution for the OEI that indicates the OEI will need to secure additional funding for training purposes.

Website: Sparkman indicated that they will work on getting the OEI website up independent of the larger county website renovation since that process is delayed.

RESJ status: The Racial Equity and Social Justice will continue and its committees will be assisting the OEI in implementing further recommendations of the racial equity analysis conducted in 2015. He anticipates that there will be rotating reports in RESJ meetings from the departments re: their efforts.
