Potential Partners for front-end diversion work

TASC -Treatment Alternatives for Safer Communities

Through a SAMHSA technical assistance grant, TASC leaders are able to work with Dane County stakeholders around behavioral health and front-end diversion. Essentially, TASC could lengage and educate county behavioral health providers around the topic of law enforcement diversion for individuals with a behavioral health issue and discuss with stakeholders, what would be needed/expected from them in order for this front end diversion to occur county wide.
