ACCEPTING GRANT FUNDS FOR MADISON AREA RECOVERY INITIATIVE AND CREATING NEW BUDGET LINES FOR CONTRACT WITH CONNECTIONS COUNSELING DCDHS - ACS DIVISION

15 16 The Dane County Department of Human Services is receiving a portion of funds from a grant in order to establish a new services contract with Connections Counseling. The City of Madison Police Department (MPD) is the recipient of a Smart Policing Initiative Grant from the U.S. Department of Justice that covers the period of Aug 1, 2017 – June 30, 2020. This grant is funding the Madison Area Recovery Initiative (MARI) to address the opioid use epidemic that has affected the City of Madison and Dane County. MARI will specifically address the local conditions in Madison by helping more than 150 individuals who are arrested for minor drugrelated crimes engage in treatment. The goal is to reduce recidivism and property crime, and to reduce the rate of opioid overdose by helping more people enter into recovery following an arrest. Individuals who are arrested for committing a minor drug-related crime will be offered an opportunity to participate in MARI. If the individual agrees, they will have an opportunity to avoid criminal charges being filed, contingent upon their successful completion of the six-month MARI program, requiring treatment participation.

This new contract with Connections Counseling establishes this agency as the assessment hub for MARI participants. Following MPD contact, individuals will be given a short deadline to contact Connections Counseling and schedule an assessment. That assessment will result in an Arrest Diversion Plan that will outline the achievements and activities necessary to successfully complete MARI. Connections Counseling will also assign a Recovery Coach to support participants and assist with their engagement in substance use disorder treatment. Clinical staff from Connections Counseling will monitor individuals' progress toward completing the Arrest Diversion Plan and reporting on that progress to the MPD. MPD will then either expunge the arrest or refer the original violation for criminal charges based on whether the participant successfully completed.

Connections Counseling will receive a prorated amount for a partial year contract in 2017.
