III. State your rationale for request for waiver. Please be specific.

The spare parts list includes assemblies, modules and cards that perform functions including tower lighting, transmitter synchronizing, inter-site communications links and alarm monitoring needed to keep the DaneCom radio system operating at all times. The Department intends to purchase a list of spare parts from General Communications.

The County's maintenance agreement with Harris Corporation provides for on-site response, troubleshooting and repair – as well as removal and repair coordination for items that need out-of-state repair by the manufacturer. The spare parts would be stored at tower sites where they're likely to be needed, or at a central shop from which the technicians operate – and in either case tracked by the County and inventoried semi-annually. Their local availability will allow the radio system to continue operation while any needed repairs are made. The County purchased a package of spare parts with the original contract, and the expansion of the system adding new sites has introduced in many cases used newer components that require corresponding items added to the spares kit.

Harris Corporation subcontracts with General Communications for the local maintenance activities. General Communications has performed the installation, updated as-built documentation and verified required hardware, software and firmware release compatibility, making them uniquely and singularly qualified to deliver and maintain these items. Funding would be from CPPUBSAF 51861, Radio System Replacement.
