It is the purpose of this chapter to define the scope of authority and the nature of the diverse <u>administrative agencies</u> <u>boards and</u> <u>commissions</u> within the county governmental structure and to establish guidelines for the exercise of administrative authority. An <u>administrative agency</u> is defined to be any <u>bB</u> oards or commissions <u>are</u> created by the county board, and all or some of the members <u>of which</u> are appointed by the county executive with the concurrence of the county board.

(1) It is declared to be the express policy of this chapter to grant the public the fullest information regarding the affairs of county government. To implement this policy, all meetings of administrative agencies boards and commissions shall be publicly held and open to all personsthe public in conformance with the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law, Wis. Stat. Chap. 19, Subchapter V. at all times except as expressly provided in subsection (2) below. (2) No meeting in closed session or adjournment of a meeting into closed session shall be made without a public announcement of the general nature of the business to be discussed in closed session. Closed sessions may only be held for the following purposes: (a) Deliberating after a judicial or quasi-judicial hearing; (b) Considering the employment, dismissal, promotion, demotion, compensation or discipline of any public employee unless an open meeting is requested by the employee; (c) Discussion of matters relating to crime detection or prevention; (d) Deliberating or negotiating on the purchase of public property, the investing of public funds or conducting other public business which for competitive,

Section 15.03 is amended to read as follows: 51 **15.03 QUORUM REQUIRED.** No action of an administrative agency board or 52 commission shall have any force or effect unless such action was taken by a 53 quorum of its members. Unless otherwise specified by law, a quorum shall mean 54 the majority of the duly appointed and qualified membership of the agencyboard 55 or commission present in-person at the meeting in which the action is 56 considered. The fact that one or more members abstain from voting on a 57 particular question shall not void an otherwise legitimate quorum. 58 59 ARTICLE 5. Section 15.04 is amended to read as follows: 60 15.04 SUBCOMMITTEES AND CONSULTANTS GENERAL PROVISIONS. (1) 61 An administrative agencyboard or commission may use information, conferences 62 and consultations as a means of obtaining information and viewpoints and the 63 advice of interested persons. 64 (2)(a) As authorized by resolution adopted by the County Board and approved 65 by the County Executive, an agency may appoint subcommittees of their membership or of experts, interested persons or members of the public to advise 66 it with respect to any matter pending before it. The powers of such committee, 67 68 however, shall be advisory only. 69 (2)(ba) All subcommittees in existence as of the effective date of this 70 ordinance shall be dissolved on December 31, 2017 unless continuation is 71 approved by resolution adopted by the County Board and approved by the 72 County Executive. 73 (<mark>c</mark>b) Unless the resolution authorizing a subcommittee specifies a sunset 74 date for the subcommittee, each subcommittee shall be dissolved unless reauthorized by resolution by December 31st of the year following its most recent 75 76 authorization. 77 (3) Nothing in this section shall be construed to authorize the agencies to enter 78 into consultation contracts involving the expenditure of funds without the approval 79 of the county board. 80 (4) Unless otherwise authorized by law, the county executive shall appoint all 81 members to commissions and boards. Commissions and boards shall comply 82 with the procedural requirements specified in this ordinance. 83 (5) For all boards and commissions the terms of members shall be established 84 as hereafter provided: 85 (a) Unless otherwise required by law, citizen members shall serve staggered three year terms which shall end on the third Tuesday in April or as soon 86 87 thereafter as a successor is appointed and qualified. (b) The terms of county supervisor members shall be: 88 89 **1.** Two (2) years in length and shall coincide with their term of election, thus 90 ending on the third Tuesday in April, if the terms of citizen members on the particular board or commission are three (3) years or less in length; or 91 Page 2 of 22

97	(c) Unless otherwise prohibited by law, the term of any member of a board or
98	commission whose membership is based on his or her status as a county board
99	supervisor, shall automatically terminate as of the date on which he or she no
100	longer holds the office of county board supervisor. This provision is not subject
101	to subsection (2) of this section.
102	(d) Unless otherwise prohibited by law, the term of any member of a board or
103	commission whose membership is based on his or her status as an official of a
104	city, village or town shall automatically terminate as of the date on which he or
105	she no longer holds the referenced municipal office or position. This provision is
106	not subject to subsection (2) of this section.
107	(e) In any event, the term of a board or commission member shall continue until
108	a successor is duly appointed and qualified.
109	(f) All appointments to fill vacancies occurring within a term shall be for the
110	remainder of the unexpired term.
111	(6) Members of a board or commission who fail to attend three consecutive
112	meetings without good and sufficient reason, shall be removed at the discretion
113	of the Dane County Executive. The board or commission chair shall notify the
114	County Executive if a member is subject to removal under this subsection.
115	(7) (a) To the extent permitted by law, all non-supervisor members of boards or
116	commissions organized under this chapter shall be compensated at the same
117	per diem rate as is paid to county board supervisors for each day an agency
118	meeting is attended, to a maximum of sixty (60) meetings per year for any one
119	agency.
120	(8) Per diems shall not be authorized in the following instances:
121	(a) For any elected official of any city, village or town who serves on an
122	administrative agency in an official capacity as a representative of his or her
123	municipality;
124	(b) For county personnel, other than supervisors, except that the county
125	employee member of the equal opportunity commission shall be compensated as
126	are other commission members for attending meetings occurring at times when
127	the employee-member is not in pay status.
128	(9) Any member of a board or commission claiming meeting payments or
129	expenses, or both, shall submit a completed claim form to the controller before
130	payment is made. The controller is hereby authorized to return to any claimant
131	any incomplete, inaccurate or illegible claim and no meeting payments or
132	expenses shall be paid until the claim is completed according to the requirements
133	of the claim form. Except no claim shall be paid without finance committee
134	approval if submitted more than 45 days after the month in which the meeting
135	occurred.

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136	(10) Unless otherwise expressly provided, members of boards and
137	commissions shall receive mileage reimbursement for attending meetings equal
138	to that paid county officials and employees.
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140	ARTICLE 6. Section 15.05 is amended to read as follows:
141	15.05 PROCEDURAL RULES. Any agency may enact procedural rules
142	governing its proceedings which are not otherwise in conflict with this chapter or
143	other legal requirements. However, no agency may by rule provide for the
144	passage of a motion by less than a majority vote of those present and voting.
145	Unless otherwise required by statute, boards and commissions will follow county
146	board procedural rules in Chapter 7. All questions not covered by county board
147	rules shall be governed by the most recent edition of Robert's Rules of Order.
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149	ARTICLE 7. Section 15.06 is amended to read as follows:
150	15.06 JUDICIAL OR QUASI-JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS.
151	(1) This section applies in every case where the <u>board or commission</u> agency
152	decision is required by law to be made on the record after notice and an
153	opportunity for an agency hearing.
154	(2) All such interested persons, as determined by the board or commission
155	agency itself (subject to any applicable law, court ruling or board order), shall be
156	given notice and an opportunity to be heard in any judicial or quasi-judicial
157	proceeding either in person or by an attorney of the person's choice.
158	(a) The notice, unless personal service is required by law, shall be served by
159	certified mail and shall include:
160	1. A statement of the time, place and nature of the hearing;
161	2. A statement of the legal authority and jurisdiction under which the hearing is
162	to be held;
163	3. A reference to the particular sections of the statutes and ordinances involved;
164	and
165	4. A short, plain statement of the matters asserted by the proponent of this
166	action which is to be decided in the proceeding.
167	(b) Opportunity shall be afforded all parties to respond and present evidence
168	and argument on all issues involved.
169	(c) Unless otherwise precluded by law, informal disposition may be made of any
170	contested case by stipulation, agreed settlement, consent order or default.
171	(d) The record of a judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding shall contain:
172	1. All pleadings, motions and intermediate rulings;
173	2. All evidence received or considered by the administrative agencyboard or
174	commission;
175	3. A statement of any matters officially noticed;
176	4. All questions and offers of proof, objections and rulings thereon;
177	5. All proposed findings and exceptions;
178	6. All decisions, opinions and reports by the officer or agencyboard or
179	commission presiding at the hearing;
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180 7. All staff memoranda and data submitted to the hearing officer or members of 181 the administrative agencyboard or commission in connection with their 182 consideration of the case. 183 (e) Oral proceedings or any part thereof shall be transcribed at the request of 184 any interested person. The cost of transcription shall be borne equally among 185 the parties involved in the proceedings. 186 (f) Findings of fact shall be based exclusively on the evidence presented at the 187 proceedings and on matters officially noticed. 188 (3) In all judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings, the following rules of evidence 189 shall apply: 190 (a) Irrelevant, immaterial or unduly repetitious evidence shall be excluded; 191 (b) Hearsay evidence shall not be accepted unless direct evidence is not 192 available and the hearsay evidence is otherwise reliable; 193 (c) Rules of privilege recognized by law shall be respected; 194 (d) Documentary evidence may be received in the form of copies of excerpts if 195 the original is not available; and 196 (e) Notice may be taken of officially cognizable facts. 197 (4) A final decision of an administrative agency board or commission shall be in 198 writing or stated on the record. All final decisions shall include findings of fact 199 and conclusions of law, separately stated. Interested parties shall be notified 200 either personally or by certified mail of any decision or order. Upon request such 201 notification shall include a copy of the decision or order. 202 (5) In any contested judicial or quasi-judicial proceedings, members or 203 employees of the agency board or commission to render the decision or to make 204 findings of fact and conclusions of law shall not communicate directly or indirectly 205 with any party to the proceedings on any matter relating to the proceedings 206 except upon notice and opportunity for all parties to participate. 207 (6) Any interested person who has exhausted all administrative remedies 208 available within an agencyboard or commission and who is aggrieved by a final 209 decision in a contested case is entitled to judicial review of the agency's decision 210 by filing a petition for a writ of certiorari in accordance with section 252.04 of the 211 Wisconsin Statutes within 30 days after the decision has been served. 212 213 ARTICLE 8. Section 15.07 is amended to read as follows: 214 **15.07 FORMS.** Administrative agencies Boards or commissions may prepare 215 and utilize any forms which are necessary or desirable to the accomplishment of 216 the objectives of the agencybody and may require any person to utilize such forms as a prerequisite to initiating action by the agencybody. 217 218 219 ARTICLE 9. Section 15.08 is amended to read as follows: 220 15.08 MINUTES. All administrative agencies shall make and keep minutes of all 221 official proceedings and record the same in the office of the county clerk. Minutes of all meetings of boards and commissions shall be kept by staff. 222 223 224 225

226	ARTICLE 10.	Section 15.09 is amended to read as follows:

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227 15.09 POSTING OF SCHEDULED MEETINGS. Except where the 228 circumstances preclude such action, all administrative agencies shall prepare an 229 agenda of the matters to be discussed at each scheduled meeting and this 230 agenda shall be prominently displayed in the office of the county clerk for at least 231 five days immediately preceding the scheduled meeting. Where the 232 circumstances preclude posting the agenda for five or more days, the agenda 233 shall be posted as far in advance as the circumstances permit.

234 (1) A copy of the agenda, including the time and place of the meeting and of the 235 matters to be discussed, shall be given to the county clerk by noon on the Friday 236 prior to the week in which the meeting will occur for posting on the bulletin board 237 in his or her office and such other place(s) in the City-County Building which 238 provide prompt and sufficient notice to the public as soon as possible after 239 scheduling. In the event that exceptional circumstances prevent a meeting from being posted by noon on Friday before the meeting is to occur, the agenda must 240 be posted no less than 24 hours prior to the meeting and the County Clerk 241 242 should be alerted immediately.

243 (2) No committee may take action on any item which has not been posted with the agenda as specified in subsection (6) hereof (24 hour notice) unless: 244 245

(a) A delay to comply with the provisions of subsection (6) hereof would result 246 in needless expense to Dane County, would endanger health or safety or would 247 render any action of the committee meaningless, and

There can be demonstrated a good faith effort to provide as much notice as **(b)** possible to the public and the news media of the consideration of the item to be added to the agenda, and

(c) The special consideration is not an attempt to avoid the provisions of the Dane County Board rules, and

(d) Notice of the special consideration has been posted with the committee agenda for at least two hours as required by sec. 19.84(2), Wis. Stats.

(3) The minutes of any meeting during which an item receives such special consideration shall indicate that the consideration was an addition to the posted 256 agenda and that the minimum posting requirements have been met.

258 The procedures in this rule shall apply to meetings called under emergency (4) 259 situations insofar as practicable. In no case may an emergency meeting be held 260 without at least a two hour notification and an attempt to inform the news media of the time, place and subject matter to be considered. 261

(5) 262 Members constituting at least one less than a majority of the committee may 263 call a meeting of the committee or place a particular item on the agenda if, after a request to do so, the chairperson fails or refuses to call a meeting or place any 264 265 particular item on the agenda.

266 (6) In the event a scheduled meeting must be canceled, the chairperson shall provide timely notification to the county clerk and other committee members and 267 268 to the public. In the event a committee meeting is cancelled on the day of the 269 scheduled meeting, the chair shall arrange for conspicuous written notice to be 270 posted at the entrance of the location where the meeting was to be held, and on 271 the county website.

272 273 274 275	(7) In order to encourage civic participation, meetings of County Board committees shall not be scheduled on holidays or on the day of any general election.
275 276 277 278 279 280	ARTICLE 11. Section 15.10 is amended to read as follows: 15.10 OFFICERS. (1) Unless otherwise specified, each administrative <u>agencyboard or commission</u> shall elect from among its membership a chairperson, and vice-chairperson and secretary and shall assign the duties of each.
281 282 283 284 285	(2) County board supervisors are eligible to serve as officers of administrative agencies, but the offices of chairperson and vice-chairperson may not both be held by supervisors unless by a unanimous vote of the administrative agency's members.
286 287 288 289 290 291 292	ARTICLE 12. Section 15.11 is amended to read as follows: 15.11 SCOPE OF ADMINISTRATIVE POWERS. Administrative agenciesBoards and commissions shall exercise all of those powers specified in this chapter or otherwise provided by law, those powers reasonably implied by those specified powers and those powers which are essential to the carrying out of the specified powers.

Every administrative agencyboard or commission subject to this chapter, including subcommittees appointed pursuant to s. 15.04(2), shall submit an annual work plan to the County Board and the County Executive by September 1 st of each year.

377	adjunct to the human services board and shall advise the human services board

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380	ARTICLE 18. Section 15.165 is rescinded in its entirety.
381	15.165 CHILDREN COME FIRST COMMISSION. (1) The Dane County
382	Children Come First Commission shall consist of eleven voting members and
383	four ex-officio members.
384	(a) The commission's voting membership shall consist of the county executive or
385	designee; the Dane County District Attorney or designee; two county board
386	supervisors appointed by the county board chairperson; the president of the
387	Madison Metropolitan School District Board or designee; the president of the
388	board of the Dane County CESA or designee; two citizens who are parents of
389	children with SED, appointed by the county executive; one citizen with expertise
390	in managed health care, appointed by the county executive; one citizen with
391	expertise in mental health services, appointed by the county executive; and one
392	attorney with guardian ad litem experience, nominated by the chief judge and
393	appointed by the county executive.
394	(b) The ex-officio members shall consist of the secretary of the Wisconsin
395	Department of Health Services or designee; the chief juvenile circuit court judge
396	of Dane County or designee; and two representatives from non-profit human
397	service agencies familiar with the needs of children and families with disabilities,
398	designated by the county executive.
399	(c) Appointments by the county chairperson and county executive require county
400	board confirmation. Designations of members, where authorized, do not require
400	confirmation. Designations of members, where authorized, do not require
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402	(2) Citizen members, together with the attorney member, shall serve
403	staggered three-year terms ending on June 30th.
404	(2a) Transitional provision. The county executive shall designate the initial
	terms of the citizen and attorney appointees so that two appointments expire in
406	each of the first two years and one in the third year. Thereafter, all citizen and
407	attorney appointments shall be for three-year terms except that an appointment
408	to replace a member who leaves during a term of office shall be for the balance
409	of the unexpired term.

410	(3) Ex-officio members shall serve at the pleasure of their respective
411	appointing authority. Ex-officio members shall not be entitled to vote on any
412	matter before the commission but shall be entitled to participate in all debate
413	except that relating to procedural and organizational matters. Ex-officio
414	members shall not be eligible for per diems or expenses.
415	(4) The term of office on the commission for persons holding elected
416	office shall expire simultaneously with the term of elected office in effect when
417	appointed or seated as a commission member. The term of office for the
418	president of the board of the Dane County CESA shall expire as of the date he or
419	she no longer holds such office.
420	(5) A designee may be removed at any time, at the pleasure of the
421	appointing authority.
422	(6) The commission shall have the authority to oversee the CCF
423	program's implementation within approved state and county budgetary and policy
424	frameworks, and to develop recommendations to the human services director,
425	the county board and the county executive for the future of the program. This
426	authority includes the following responsibilities:
427	(a) Approve a mission statement for the human services department's provision
428	of services to children with Severe Emotional Disturbance (SED).
429	(b) Act as a consortium to continue to pursue a broader partnership for the
430	program including, but not limited to, pursuing added funding.
431	(c) Assess how the program relates to other service programs operating at the
432	county or local level and take steps to work with other programs to avoid
432	duplication of activities.
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434	(d) Ensure that relevant systems enter into meaningful interagency agreements relative to service provision and coordination that reflect the mission of the
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430	program.
_	(e) Review and approve policies and procedures relative to the children and
438	families to be served, processes for enrollment and disenrollment, and provision
439	of services.
440	(f) Approve relevant contracts or hire staff, or both, for the provision of needed
441	services for the program or to support the commission as necessary, within
442	approved county budget authority.
443	(g) Review and approve policies and procedures and make recommendations to
444	the human services director related to the provision of clinical expertise
445	necessary for the program.
446	(h) Ensure that sufficient data is collected to effectively evaluate the program's
447	compliance with desired outcomes.
448	(i) Regularly report to the community on the CCF program performance and
449	plans.
450	(7) Notwithstanding s. 15.72(1), there shall be no payment of per diems to
451	members except that county board supervisors shall be entitled to receive
452	meeting payments in accordance with chapter 6 provisions.
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456 ARTICLE 19. Section 15.18(2) is rescinded.

457 (2) Members shall serve staggered three-year terms which shall expire in April 458 or as soon thereafter as a successor is appointed and gualified. A member 459 appointed while a county board supervisor shall be considered a citizen 460 appointee from and after the date he or she no longer serves on the county 461 board. No person may serve more than two consecutive three-year terms. 462 Annual election of officers shall occur in May of even-numbered years. The 463 board chair shall inform the county executive of any member missing three 464 consecutive meetings.

466 ARTICLE 20. Section 15.195 is rescinded in its entirety.

467 15.195 AGRICULTURAL ADVISORY COUNCIL. (1) The Dane County 468 Agricultural Advisory Council shall consist of 11 members appointed by the 469 county executive. Two shall be members of the Dane County Board of 470 Supervisors. 940	(b) The terms of county supervisor members shall be:
941	1. Two (2) years in length and shall coincide with their term of election, thus
942	ending on the third Tuesday in April, if the terms of citizen members on the
943	particular board or commission are three (3) years or less in length; or
944	2. The same number of years in length as the term of citizen members if such
945	citizen member terms are four (4) years or longer. In the event of a term of four
946	years or longer for county supervisor members, the completion of the term of
947	such county supervisor member shall be contingent upon remaining a duly
948	elected county supervisor.
949	(c) Unless otherwise prohibited by law, the term of any member of an
950	administrative agency whose membership is based on his or her status as a
951	county board supervisor, shall automatically terminate as of the date on which he
952	or she no longer holds the office of county board supervisor. This provision is not
953	subject to subsection (2) of this section.
954	(d) Unless otherwise prohibited by law, the term of any member of an
955	administrative agency whose membership is based on his or her status as an
956	official of a city, village or town shall automatically terminate as of the date on

957	which he or she no longer holds the referenced municipal office or position. This
958	provision is not subject to subsection (2) of this section.
959	(2) In any event, the term of a board or commission member shall continue until
960	a successor is duly appointed and qualified.
961	(3) All appointments to fill vacancies occurring within a term shall be for the
962	remainder of the unexpired term.
963	
964	15.72 COMPENSATION OF APPOINTEES. (1) To the extent permitted by law,
965	all non-supervisor members of administrative bodies or agencies organized
966	under this chapter shall be compensated at the same per diem rate as is paid to
967	county board supervisors for each day an agency meeting is attended, to a
968	maximum of sixty (60) meetings per year for any one agency.
969	(2) Per diems shall not be authorized in the following instances:
970	(a) For any elected official of any city, village or town who serves on an
971	administrative agency in an official capacity as a representative of his or her
972	municipality;
973	(b) For county personnel, other than supervisors, except that the county
974	employee member of the equal opportunity commission shall be compensated as
975	are other commission members for attending meetings occurring at times when
976	the employee-member is not in pay status.
977	(3) Any member of an administrative agency claiming meeting payments or
978	expenses, or both, shall submit a completed claim form to the controller before
979	payment is made. The controller is hereby authorized to return to any claimant
980	any incomplete, inaccurate or illegible claim and no meeting payments or
981	expenses shall be paid until the claim is completed according to the requirements
982	of the claim form. Except no claim shall be paid without finance committee
983	approval if submitted more than 45 days after the month in which the meeting
984	occurred.
985	(4) Unless otherwise expressly provided, members of administrative agencies
986	shall receive mileage reimbursement for attending meetings equal to that paid
987	county officials and employees.
988	
989	15.725 COMPENSATION FOR SUBCOMMITTEE. Persons subject to the
990	provisions of sec. 15.72 shall receive compensation for subcommittee work in
991	accordance with the provisions of sec. 6.03.
