Narrative/Assumptions about long range fiscal effect:

Funding comes from the Crisis Intervention benefit in Medicaid and fees charged to residents who receive SSI payments. Revenue is earned after services are provided. Local match of the revenue from Medicaid is required. However, these local funds have already been budgeted. There is no local match required for funds received from SSI recipients. If funding is not made available for these services then some individuals will remain in institutional settings and some homeless individuals could experience unnecessarily prolonged episodes of homelessness as a result. Accepting these funds also allows for certain individuals to be safely served in the community.
