


World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

Elder Abuse is a violation of human rights and a significant cause of illness, injury, loss of productivity, isolation, and despair.

Elder Abuse is one of the most overlooked public health issues in the United States. Research indicates that 1 out of 10 community-based elders suffer abuse, neglect, or exploitation. However, it is estimated that only 1 in 23 cases are reported. Dane County Human Services investigated 459 cases of elder abuse and/or neglect in 2017. This number will only grow as 10,000 baby boomers turn age 65 each day.
