Presentation to Dane County Board of Supervisors – 2019 Budget

The Dane County Veterans Service Office continues its important mission of advocating for and serving Dane County Veterans and families. Thank you for your ongoing support!

2017 Office Highlights:

- Staff restructured from six FTE to five FTE and two 0.5 FTE. Changes allow for increased flexibility with office coverage and for coverage of outreach events.
- Hiring new Deputy Veterans Service Director James Quattromani.
- Client contacts up 46% from 2016.
- Instrumental in helping Dane County Veterans/families realize more than \$68M in Federal Compensation and Pension dollars. Accredited veterans service officers file these claims daily.
- Over \$185M in total benefit dollars received by Dane County Veterans/families.
- Aided in eviction and utility disconnect prevention for 73 households through Emergency Assistance funds.
- Provided gas and grocery assistance for 44 individual veterans.
- Roughly 150 regular users of *Vets Ride with Pride* bus pass program. Helps disabled veterans to get to and from work, medical appointments, therapy groups, etc.

2018 Initiatives:

- Participating in revising Dane County Veterans Treatment Court policy and procedures manual.
- Ongoing advocacy work for our Dane County veterans and families.
- Continued community collaboration with VA Medical Center, VA Homeless Program Social Workers, HUD-VASH, housing developments, and more.

Sustainability Efforts:

Office completely digitized.

Veterans Service Office 9/13/2018

- Desktop scanners and electronic submission of VA claims has greatly decreased outgoing mail, saving on mail costs and targeting related resource depletion.
- Human sustainability: Staff provided with standing/raising desks, ergonomic chairs, etc.

Racial Equity & Social Justice:

- Inherent to what we do, as we are local advocates for our client base which consists largely of disabled veterans, including persons of color and women.
- Increased focus on Veterans Benefits Administration needs-based benefits (natural emphasis on low income/marginalized population).
- Non-needs based benefits (service-connected disability) focused on disabled populations.
- Seeking expansion of Veterans Ride with Pride program METRO passes for disabled/veterans of need.
- Collaboration with Tribal Veterans Service Offices (TVSOs) and Native American veterans.
- Increased focus on outreach: homeless stand-down, disability rights groups, justice-involved veterans, ongoing collaboration with VA social work, homeless program.
