577 Support authorizing legislation for a Regional Transit Authority (RTA) that is flexible enough 578 to adapt to local needs and has these basic parameters: A representative RTA could be 579 formed by one or more municipal governing bodies passing resolutions in support. A 580 referendum would need to be adopted by a majority of voters in each municipality forming, 581 or seeking to join the RTA. The amount of the sales tax would need to be authorized in the 582 referendum, but could not exceed 0.5%. The governing board would be composed of 583 elected officials, representative of the communities within the RTA area. 584 Regional Transit Authority (RTA): Restore statutory language to allow creation of a Regional Transit Authority/Authorities covering at a minimum the federally designated 585 Metropolitan Planning Area, and support statutory language to allow up to a half-cent 586 587 sales tax which would go to citizens for a binding referendum, be contingent on receiving federal transit funds and RTA governance/operating structure would be determined after 588 consultation with community partners participating in the RTA. - Local Transportation: Support a greater share of state and federal transportation funding
 going toward local transportation needs and services. Funding should be increased for
 General Transportation Aids, State Highway Maintenance, the County Highway
 Improvement Program (CHIPS) and Specialized Transportation for older adults and
 persons with disabilities.

- North Mendota Parkway: Oppose the construction of four lanes on Main Street (HWY 19) in Waunakee. Support an update of the 2003 North Mendota Parkway traffic study, and request WIDOT to consider how the proposed North Mendota Parkway, Hwy 19, CTH K, CTH M and Hwy 13 relate to each other and Hwy 12. Support an implementation review of the "North E-Way".
- Verona Road Project: Support mitigation measures to lessen the impact of the Verona Road construction project on surrounding neighborhoods and local businesses. Those measures include noise barriers, monitoring air quality, preservation of commercial areas, minimizing impacts on established neighborhoods, storm water management (steer away from Dunn's Marsh), and develop bike lanes, pedestrian/bicycle bridges and sidewalks on frontage and neighborhood roads.
- Highway Funding: Require WIDOT to provide more funding up front through
 operational reimbursement and incentivizing improvements.
