General Principle

The state shall foster equitable and inclusive opportunities for all state residents by supporting and funding proactive, evidence-based programs and policies that advance the elimination of racial and socio-economic disparities and recognize the unique role counties play in administering state programs by:

- Fairly sharing responsibility with the counties in determining the scope, design, and cost of statewide programs;
- Providing adequate and predictable shares of funding for state services delivered by the counties;
- 3. Helping counties reduce the need to rely on property taxes; and
- 4. Enhancing the ability of counties to more effectively manage county government.

In furthering these principles Dane County will assess policies via an analysis that asks:

- Who benefits?
- Who is burdened?
- Who does not have a voice at the table?
- How can policymakers mitigate unintended consequences?

Elections

- Voter Registration Changes and Voter Identification Requirement: Oppose legislation that
 changes same day voter registration, alters-reduces times for absentee ballot voting and requires
 photo identification to vote.
- Support Wisconsin's Successful System of Election Day Voter Registration: Support Election
 Day voter registration and urge Wisconsin Legislature to maintain the currentsystem.
- County Board Elections: Change the state statutes requiring County Board members to be sworn in on the third Tuesday to allow the seating of temporary Board members until a recount iscompleted.
- Public Funding for Elections: Support public funding/financing for local/and state elections.

Community, Workforce and Economic Development

- Wisconsin's Fair Employment Act: Oppose permitting an employer to refuse to employ, bar or terminate from employment an individual who has been convicted of a felony and who has not been pardoned for that felony, and pre-empting local government from adopting ordinances concerning employment discrimination based on arrest or conviction records that prohibit activity allowed under the state Fair EmploymentAct.
- Minimum Wage: Enacted 11/4/14 Referendum Ballot question, "Should the State of Wisconsin increase the minimum wage to \$10.10 per hour?" Dane County voters approved this item by 73.6% yes votes and 26.4% no votes. Support increasing the minimum wage.
- UW Cooperative Extension: 's Relationship with Dane County Extension Department and
 Wisconsin Idea Partnership: Support Wisconsin Idea Partnership to address funding reductions
 to UW System through the budgetbill and the impacts that the Badger Partnership will create
 for UW Extension and its partnerships with county extension agencies, including the Dane
 County Extension Department Support adequate staffing and funding levels to sustain Dane
 County Extension's high-quality educational programs for farmers, businesses, communities,
 families and young people.
- Collective Bargaining and Workers Rights: Support all workers having the right to seek safe working conditions, benefits and fair pay through collective bargaining and oppose legislation that weakensit.
- **UW Hospital & Clinics (UWHC):** Support restoring the rights of workers at UWHC.
- Student Debt: Support legislation to lower student debt by any means possible, including
 refinancing loans, implementing tax breaks for those paying back the loans, reducing interest
 rates and ensuring tuition is affordable.
- School Choice Expansion: Oppose any legislation/action to expanding the voucher program or a similar facsimile in the Madison Metropolitan School District or in any Dane County school system
- Rural Broadband Coverage: Urge the State of Wisconsin to Support increaseing financial support /seek federal funding to expand broadband services to underserved rural areas.

-Arts

- Arts Funding: Support increased funding for the arts across Wisconsin, especially for art projects in communities, schools, colleges, and public facilities.
- Wisconsin Arts Agency: The state shall fully fund and create a free standing Wisconsin Arts
 Agency to enhance the lives of youth, older adults and all Wisconsin citizens by funding art
 projects in Communities, Schools, Colleges and Public Works/Building construction across the
 state.
