### SPARC

#### **Supporting Partnerships for Anti-Racist Communities**

- Started in September 2016 by Center for Social Innovation
- Aim: Understand and respond to racial inequities in homelessness
- Partnering with 10 communities nationwide for HMIS data analysis, interviews with folks experiencing homelessness



### National Disparities I National Alliance to Homelessness

#### Most Minority Groups Make up a Larger Share of the Homeless Population Than They Do of the General Population

Race and ethnicity of those experiencing homelessness compared with the general population





## National Disparities

#### Most Minority Groups Experience Homelessness at Much Higher Rates Than Whites

Number of homeless people per 10,000 population by race and ethnicity

# Why?

"This is no accident; it is the result of centuries of structural racism that have excluded historically oppressed people—particularly Black and Native Americans—from equal access to housing, community supports, and opportunities for economic mobility."

# Domains of Inequality

- Economic Mobility & Network Impoverishment
- Housing
- Criminal Justice
- Behavioral Health
- Family Stabilization



# Policy Strategies

• Implement and enforce existing **fair housing protections** with the full force of local, state, and federal government.

• Develop **new affordable housing stock** (inclusionary zoning, mandatory affordable units for new developments.)

• **Regulate evictions more** closely. Appropriate representation for folks facing eviction.

- **Prevent speculators** from conducting mass evictions or choosing not to renew leases of tenants (legislation, regulations)
- Enact national tenants' rights legislation.



# **Policy Strategies**

- Re-introduce **rent control** into large urban markets.
- Enact **criminal justice system reform** (limit scope of background checks, sealing non-violent records, change subsidy eligibility reqs.)
- Restructure relationship between property value **education/public works funding**
- **Reform child welfare system** specifically focusing on family reunification.
- Enact **immigration policies** that increase the likelihood of engagement of Hispanic/Latinx people in seeking help



# Other Strategies

- Board and decision-making bodies representative of population served
- **Communication is inclusive** of underrepresented groups
- Train staff to better understand racism and the intersection of racism and homelessness
- Create professional development opportunities for emerging leaders of different races



# Other Strategies

- Review coordinated entry processes to understand impact on people of different races and ethnicities
- Collecting data to better understand patterns of program use for people of different races and ethnicities
- Conducting additional research to understand the scope and needs of different races or ethnicities experiencing homelessness



# Other Strategies

- Sustained economic investment in communities of color
- Expand affordable housing availability, and make sure units go to folks most at risk of homelessness
- Implement and enforce fair housing legislation
