2. Discussion of and Planning for June Committee Listening Session

Members discussed holding a joint listening session with the Dunn's Marsh/Allied Drive Neighborhood associations. Location would be in one of the neighborhoods. Members discussed the need for a downtown Madison listening session as well. Members would like to hear from individuals experiencing homelessness and suggested The Beacon or The Central Library as potential locations. Ketcham will reach out to neighborhood associations about meeting at Revival Ridge, Reach Dane, or Boys and Girls Club for the proposed Dunn's Marsh/Allied Drive listening session. Ketcham will follow up next month with information.

Members discussed importance of taking public comment before and after the meeting to accommodate members of the public and increase access to the meeting.

D. Presentations

1. Update From The Committee to End Youth Homelessness - Robin Serano, Chair, Homeless Services Consortium Committee to End Youth Homelessness

Presenters: Robin Sereno, Chair, Homeless Services Consortium Committee to End Youth Homelessness. Sharita Holden, Shanon Holmes, members, Homeless Services Consortium Youth Action Board.

Sharita Holden, member of the Youth Action Board for the Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program, shared her concerns with youth aging out of community resources and not knowing where to go for support. Some youth are not able to stay with parents after they turn 18 because of lease or housing requirements for the parent as the lease holder. Information about the system while youth are still in school would be helpful.

Shanon Holmes, member of the Youth Action Board for the Homeless Services Consortium, spoke of the importance of school staff being aware of resources for youth and being comfortable communicating with youth about resources that exist.
