2018 Year-End Financial Report

The financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2018 are presented for your information and review. The 2018 results built upon the financial success that started in 2015, resulting in four consecutive years with the Center ending the year in a net revenue position. Operating revenue was down 3%, while operating expenses were up 1% compared to 2017. Together these changes resulted in a 23% decrease in operating income for 2018. Net revenue after non-operating items was down 62% compared to 2017. These results were anticipated based upon our event schedule for the year. Although we played host to two national shows in 2017 - the American Junior Shorthorns and National Junior Angus, as well as the World Clydesdale Show, they did not make up for the national shows that we hosted in 2016 – USTA Tumbling, the All American Junior Sheep Show, American Dairy Goat Association National Show, and the U.S. Twirling Association Championships. In addition, we did not host the every other year Wisconsin Cheesemakers Convention in 2018. Finally, the Paddlesports Retailers show that was new in 2017 did not return, and neither did the Ho Chunk General Council.

Our overall attendance was predictably down 14.4%, primarily as a result the changes in, national events and other event changes noted above. Most of our annual events experienced continued strong attendance numbers. The Center will not be playing host to any rotating national events in 2019 which will definitely create a challenge when it comes to continuing our streak of profitable years. We will see the return of the Wisconsin Cheesemakers Convention 2019 which will help. In addition, we are hopeful that we can add a couple new events and continue to build upon what looks to be a strong year for concerts and family events.

Relative to 2017, all expense categories except "Other Operating Expenses" saw decreases. "Personal Services," the Center's largest expense for salaries and benefits was down 2% from 2017 as a result of fewer labor intensive events and tight turnovers in 2018. "Other Operating Expenses" contains expenses for supplies, building, grounds and equipment maintenance, repairs, marketing, and expenses incurred and rebilled to shows. "Contractual" expenses include incentive payments provided to concert promoters for presenting their events in the Coliseum. Also included in this category are charges from the Dane County Sheriff's Office for deputy services. "Utilities" were up slightly because of the high electrical demands of the national events the Center hosted. Although the Utility costs were up slightly, they were not up as much as they would have been without the significant investment in energy efficiency improvements made on the campus over the past few years. "Indirect Charges" are payments to the General Fund for legal, accounting, purchasing, technology and other services. Our staff continues to work diligently to reduce expenses wherever possible without impacting service delivery to our customers.

Center management continues to work on addressing the capital needs of our aging venues and grounds. As has been the case the last several years, most capital improvements have been funded through borrowing proceeds in 2018. However, the Center cannot continue to indefinitely defer necessary maintenance and rely on borrowing to address its capital needs. Prior to the economic collapse in 2007 the Center was able to generate sufficient revenues to fund approximately \$700,000 per year in capital improvements without the use of borrowing proceeds. The Center needs to get back to that level of capital investment from its operations or other funding sources. Continuing to rely on debt to address the capital needs of the Center is not sustainable in the long run. The Center's debt service related to the New Holland Pavilions began in 2015, providing no relief from the end of Exhibition Hall debt payments in 2014. In fact, given the structure of the outstanding debt the Center is responsible for, there will not be any appreciable decrease in debt payments until 2020, and that assumes the Center does not have any future borrowings. For that reason, the Center did not borrow its customary \$500,000 in 2015 and reduced it's borrowing to \$250,000 in 2016, 2017 and 2018. For 2019 the Center will again only borrow \$250,000. Depending upon the terms of a new naming rights deal or financing package for any potential implementation of our master plan, 2020 presents an opportunity to begin financing some of the operational capital needs of the center out of operations once again.

One of the keys to successful financial results for the Center is the recruitment of larger events. Large events generate more revenue, with relatively little incremental costs. Most larger events can be presented within existing staff levels, with supplemental assistance in key areas. The Center is doing a good job of booking rotating national events in alternating years to avoid major swings in business from one year to the next. The New Holland Pavilions and our arrangement with Destination Madison for a contracted sales position have been instrumental in this effort.

2019 will be a challenging year for the Center. We have budgeted for an overall loss of approximately \$82,000 with no capital outlay expenditures from operations. A large part of the budgeted loss is due to a \$60,000 special assessment from the City of Madison for roadway and utility improvements on Koster and Rusk Avenues that will significantly improve drainage and manage stormwater flow in and around the western edge of the campus. However, we are confident that we can do better than that based on some changes that have happened since the budget was put together. As mentioned before, we maintained a reduced level of new borrowing for 2019 to fund capital needs, however there should be enough carryforward funding from 2018 to address those needs. The strong results for 2018 have increased the Center's reserves to just over \$1.75 million at the end of 2018. There is still a ways to go to get the reserves to our desired \$2.0 million level, but 2018 made tremendous progress towards that goal. At this time, the 2019 schedule appears to be considerably lighter than 2018 with the absence of any national shows. We continue to explore new areas for revenue generation, as well as work with new promoters to present some first-time events that we hope will grow into strong annual events.

Our customer feedback and retention levels indicate that our staff continues to deliver a high level of service that is appreciated by our customers. Responses received from our users, both positive and negative, are shared throughout the organization. The Center's facilities compliment others in the market. We frequently work with Monona Terrace, the Kohl Center, Camp Randall, and others to effectively and efficiently present events for the benefit of visitors and the local community.

The staff and I thank you for your support of the Center and the assistance provided. Your questions and comments are always welcome. 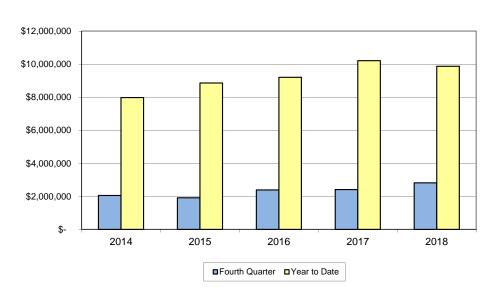
