D. Presentations

1. Update From the Homeless Services Consortium Shelter Providers Committee - Carly Sobye, HSC Shelter Providers Committee Chair

Presenter answered questions from committee members regarding the pay to stay shelter model, a program that Salvation Army is considering for their new shelter development.

Presenter answered committee questions regarding the need for a new men's shelter. This project is in the exploratory phase but the need is there.

Presenter answered committee questions regarding the 90 day stay limits in place at the shelters for men and women, and service capacity at those shelters.

Porchlight Men's Shelter: 1171 individual total served, 131 (11%) stayed more than 90 days. This shelter does not turn people away due to capacity of its facilities.
Salvation Army Women's Shelter: 518 individuals total served, 61 (12%) stayed more than 90 days.

•At TSA, there are 22 rooms for families and 45 beds for single women. The turnaway numbers vary each day depending on the need vs. capacity at shelter that night. The only exception for guaranteed admission for families are infants six months or younger (winter) and infants three months or younger (summer). There is no other emergency shelter families can be referred to if denied.
