1. CPS Presentation - Julie Ahnen

Ahnen reviewed CPS' philosophy, practice, staffing and racial disparities. CPS should only be involved with families when there's a mandate for involvement defined by State Statutes and state CPS standards. We prioritize relative care and family reunification. CPS struggles include staffing and racial disparities - people transfer, there are significant hiring delays, supervisor time is spent training instead of supporting workers, etc. Twenty new workers have started in the last two years. There is an over representation of African American in CPS cases. Addiction, poverty and homelessness continues. The peer support system program for staff is beginning as well as family and community engagement social workers offering intensive support.

Bettin reported that the Youth Commission has been holding listening sessions all over the county. Youth Centers play a very important role in the life of students. She asked for continued support. The Youth Commission is hosting the first research summit on November 8 at Union South with presentations and youth feedback. Researchers who have used the youth assessment survey data will discuss how they have used it. • We are working toward the closure of the Human Services office in Stoughton while not leaving service gaps and addressing community concerns.
