FOLKS as a "FRIEND" OF FISH CAMP PARK

FOLKS has made the following contributions to Fish Camp Park:

EQUIPMENT:

Financial assistance for the handicapped accessible pier Provided picnic tables Maintains picnic tables Funded a memorial bench Purchased birdhouse poles A second memorial bench is funded and planned

GROUNDS:

Planted native flowers at entrance sign to park
Maintains that bed
Created and planted a shoreline garden
Maintains the shoreline garden
Weeded and mulched mature trees
Collected seeds from our plants to grow seedlings for "Plant Dane"

EDUCATION:

Designed the signage explaining the advantage of native plants along the shoreline Built a little house for educational brochures
Registered the park as a monarch way station
Contacted other "friends" groups to create monarch corridor in Dane County
Conducted aquatic canoe/kayak tours of Door Creek and the Yahara River from the park

STRUCTURES:

Got repair estimates on roofing, siding and painting to help with planning

Found a mill that would recreate the unique siding for repairing rotting boards on the two
historic buildings

Hired contractors to do the repairs

Funded the wood and contractor costs

POSSIBLE FUTURE PROJECTS:

Open the net house for public use
Support the new bike trail through the park
Financial assistance to repair/replace one of the fishing piers
Put in goose deterrent wires near garden
Establish a rain garden
Other shoreline plantings
Remove/Fix drains that run directly into lake

OTHER MAJOR FOLKS PROJECTS TO EDUCATE MEMBERS & CLEAN UP LAKE KEGONSA:

Carp Removal: Bottom feeders that stir up nutrients; removed 367,599 lbs so far, 2017-2019

Leaf Management: Education of homeowners and vacuuming leaves all around the lake

Debris Pick Up: Working with Dane County to pick up aquatic debris from the end of piers

Water Monitoring: More than 20 volunteers at 14 sites on Lake Kegonsa and Door Creek; More than 400 data collections in 2018

Lake Levels presentation: Attended by >220 people, Joe Parisi & John Reimer, speakers

COUNTY PROJECTS OF MAJOR IMPORTANCE TO LAKE KEGONSA:

Door Creek Suck the Muck: Door Creek is scheduled for 2020. Door Creek contributes the 2nd highest phosphorus load to the Yahara chain but is 5th on the list to be remediated.

Dredging in Yahara River below LaFollette Dam: Scheduled for 2020. As the southernmost lake in the Yahara chain it is extremely important that water which flows into Lake Kegonsa from the upper lakes has a clear channel to flow out.

Land Purchase Program: Support land acquisition along Door Creek and in the Door Creek Wetland area to decrease runoff into Lake Kegonsa and mitigate flooding.
