



Service Structure





HOME Investment Partnerships Program

 Block grant program where funds may only be used for <u>affordable</u> housing-related initiatives

 May use funds for capital projects, operating subsidies, or homeownership initiatives

- City of Madison current goals:

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

- Eligible activities include housing, job creation, public service support, infrastructure improvements, and public facility improvements

 - Micro-Enterprise Development
 - Public Service* (Center Operations)



Program focuses on ensuring homelessness is rare, brief and nonreoccurring by funding outreach, shelter operations, Rapid-Re Housing or prevention activities.


