Pre Arrest Deflection DiversionRESPONSESINNOVATION

- Need for other options for law enforcement to divert people
- Lack of formal pre-arrest diversion process

 Law enforcement mental health screening tool needed

- Living Room model; Crisis Restoration Centers; 23 hour facilities; 24/7 mobile crisis; 911 embedded resources
- LEAD (Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion); STEER
- Short MH/BH screeners at "warm hand off"; tech response to communication; tele-psychs

Emergency Detentions

- <u>RESPONSES</u>
- Better practices
- Excessive travel time transporting (Law Enforcement) to facilities
- Length of Time spent

- <u>INNOVATIONS:</u> Pre-plea diversion (Cook County, LA County)
 - Misdemeanor Mental Health Diversion (LA County)
 - Collaboration between cj actors and provider
 - Public defender starts process screens incoming arraignments by police report and record
 - NO DV's per Prosecutor request
- Other programs? Facilities?

Systems Coordination, Resources and Measurement

- Lack of Diverse Psych providers
- Long wait lists
- Lack of communication between government, I.e., service providers
- Measure of effectiveness? Standards of practice
- Number of crisis workers, crisis beds,
- First responder knowledge of available spaces, and level of service needed
