## What is Point-in-Time (PIT)?

- A snapshot of people experiencing homelessness on a given night
- Count of people in HUD homeless category 1
- Sheltered count: emergency shelters and tra nsitional housing
- Unsheltered count: streets, cars, tents, etc.
- Coordinated by HSC Point-in-Time Committee
- 4th Wednesday in J anuary and July

Other ways to understand the extent of homelessness:

## Coordinated Entry Housing Prio rity list

People who reported staying at shelters or unsheltered locations and in need of housing

- 577 sing le adults
- 170 fa milies with children (11/1/2019)

- On the night of J uly 24,2019
- Mild weather: high 85 , low 60 , a round 70 degrees during the unsheltered count
- 11 teams/ 44 volunteers on the PITnight
- Post count by 5 additional volunteers at The Beacon, Bethel, Safe Haven, a nd remote camp sites

## Lack of affordable housing is the main reason for homelessness.

- FairMarket Rent fora two-bedroom a partment is \$1,093.
- A single parent working full time at $\$ 12 /$ hour has to pay $53 \%$ of the family's gross income for rent. Having to pay higher than $30 \%$ of your inc ome for housing is considered not affordable.
- With the $3 \%$ rental vacancy rate, fa milies with less than perfect rental histories are often denied housing.


## Racial disparity is a nother big factor.

African Americans make up 6\% of the general population in Dane County;

48\% of the homeless population identified in J uly PIT.

## C a uses of racial dispanty

## Deep poverty is a predic tor for homelessness.

Dane County poverty rate- Afric an Americ an 32\%; white 9\% National a verage-Afric an Americ an 21\%; white 10\%

But poverty alone doesn't explain the disparity.
Afric an Americ ans make up 6\% general population in Dane County; $13 \%$ of people in poverty; $48 \%$ of people experiencing homelessness.

Rental housing disc rimination: Afric an Americansare shown fewer rental units, offered higher rents, denied more leasesthan whites.

Incarceration: Afric an Americ an a dults were a rrested at a rate eight times higher than whites; $43 \%$ of all new Da ne Co prison placements in 2012 were black (2013 Race to Equity Report).
Mental health treatment Afric an Americ a ns are $10 \%$ more likely to report psychological distress and farmore likely to be uninsured.
