2	AN INITIAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING
3	GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS AND PROMISSORY NOTES

4 WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors (the "County Board") of Dane County, 5 Wisconsin (the "County") hereby finds and determines that it is necessary, desirable and in the 6 best interest of the County to issue, pursuant to Chapter 67, Wisconsin Statutes, general 7 obligation bonds and/or promissory notes in an amount of not to exceed \$158,650,000 for public 8 purposes consisting of (a) paying the cost of various items included in the County's Capital 9 Budget including but not limited to: general government; public safety; human services; 10 conservation and economic development; culture and recreation; public works projects; and the Dane County Airport terminal modernization project, as listed with estimated project costs below 11 and (b) paying professional fees and expenses in connection with the issuance of the general 12 13 obligation bonds and/or promissory notes (collectively, the "Project"):

- WHEREAS, the County Board finds and determines that the Project is within the
 County's power to undertake and serves a "public purpose" as that term is defined in Section
 67.04(1)(b) of the Wisconsin Statutes; and
- WHEREAS, counties are authorized by the provisions of Chapter 67, Wisconsin Statutes to borrow money and to issue general obligation bonds and promissory notes for such public purposes.
- 237 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of the County that:

238 <u>Section 1. Authorization of 2020 Obligations</u>. For the purpose of financing the Project, 239 there shall be borrowed pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the principal sum not 240 to exceed \$158,650,000. The County expects to issue general obligation promissory notes to 241 finance all projects described above with a term of 10 years or less and the County expects to 242 issue general obligation bonds to finance the projects described above with a term of 20 years 243 (collectively, the "2020 Obligations").

- The County is authorized to proceed with the Project in advance of borrowing pursuant to Section 29.52(11) of the Dane County Ordinance, and the Controller is authorized to issue checks for capital items above.
- 247 <u>Section 2. Sale of the 2020 Obligations</u>. The County Board hereby authorizes and
 248 directs that the 2020 Obligations be offered for public sale. At a subsequent meeting, the County
 249 Board shall consider such bids for the 2020 Obligations as may have been received and take
 250 action thereon.
- 251 Section 3. Official Notice of Sale. The Controller (in consultation with the County's 252 municipal advisor, Ehlers & Associates, Inc. ("Ehlers")) is hereby authorized and directed to 253 cause the sale of the 2020 Obligations to be publicized at such times and in such manner as the 254 Controller may determine and to cause copies of a complete Notice of Sale and other pertinent 255 data to be forwarded to interested bidders as the Controller (in consultation with Ehlers) may 256 determine.
- 257 <u>Section 4. Official Statement</u>. The Controller (in consultation with Ehlers) shall also
 258 cause an Official Statement to be prepared and distributed. The appropriate County officials
 259 shall determine when the Official Statement is final for purposes of Securities and Exchange
 260 Commission Rule 15c2-12 and shall certify said Statement, such certification to constitute full
 261 authorization of such Statement under this Resolution.
- Section 5. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability; Effective Date. All prior resolutions,
 rules or other actions of the County Board or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions
 hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the
 event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid,
 such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take
 effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law.
