Providers shall offer asset development activities and programs including, but not limited to, tutoring and academic support, prevention education, recreation and sport activities, life and social skill development, peer mediation, community service and leadership training and opportunities. Services will take place in a supervised after-school setting, five days a week during the school year. Summer programming includes day camps and special events.
