ES	TABLISHING THE PUBLIC PROTECTION AND JUDICIARY COMMITTEE
	FINES AND FEES SUBCOMMITTEE

In recent years, the County Board has become increasingly concerned with the impact on low income individuals of fines and fees assessed in the civil and criminal justice systems. In the 2019 budget, the County Board eliminated the county charges for families when their child is in the secure juvenile detention facility, and the 2020 budget eliminated the fees for youth placed in post-dispositional home detention.

Rather than continue to address fees and fines one-by-one, the Public Protection and Judiciary Committee has discussed establishing a subcommittee to complete a comprehensive review of fines and fees. The purpose is to review the current fines and fees assessed in the civil, human services, and criminal justice system throughout Dane County and determine how Dane County can reduce or eliminate these fees, fines, and costs. The review would include analysis of the financial hardship and justice hardship placed on low income individuals and their families because of these fees. Finally, the subcommittee would make recommendations on approaches

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Public Protection and Judiciary Committee Fines
 and Fees Subcommittee be established with 13 <u>14</u> members:
- 22 -- Presiding Dane County Circuit Court Judge or designee
- 23 -- The District Attorney or designee
- 24 -- The Dane County Sheriff's Office or designee
- 25 -- The Public Defender or designee
- 26 --The Clerk of Courts or designee
- 27 -- The Director of the Office of Equity and Inclusion or designee
- 28 --An Alder from the Madison Common Council, appointed by the Common Council President
- --The following members, jointly appointed by the Chair of the County Board and the Chair of thePublic Protection and Judiciary Committee:
- One county board member who serves on the Public Protection and Judiciary Committee,
 One county board members who serves on the Health and Human Needs Committee,
- -5 Individuals who have been impacted by fines and fees within the human services, civil
 justice, and/or criminal justice system; or representatives from community organizations
 that work directly with people impacted by fines and fees within the human services, civil
 justice, and/or criminal justice system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duties of the subcommittee shall be to complete a
comprehensive review of the current fines and fees assessed in the civil, human services, and
criminal justice system in Dane County and determine how Dane County can reduce or eliminate
these fees, fines, and costs. Finally, the subcommittee shall make recommendations on
approaches to mitigate the impact of these charges.

recommendations, to include recommendations for the 2021 county budget, to the Public
Protection and Judiciary Committee and the Health and Human Needs Committee before
September 15, 2020.
