2. CJC-Behavioral Health Subcommittee Quarterly Summary

Chair of the CJC Behavioral Health Subcommittee, Director Tessmann, provided an update on the work of the subcommittee.

The CJC-Behavioral Health subcommittee started in July of 2019, and has met every month for a total of 7 meetings thus far. The subcommittee has broad representation of agencies at the intersection of behavioral health and criminal justice. The subcommittee uses the Sequential Intercept Model to examine the intercepts of connection between the justice system and behavioral health, and has started by working on intercepts 0 and 1 (community and law enforcement). The subcommittee has reviewed and updated previous recommendations and prioritized the crisis system, lack of diversion options, and involuntary commitment as the areas of focus in intercept 0 and intercept 1.

Discussion ensued.

3. Drug Court Evaluation

Presented by Colleen Clark-Bernhardt, Catherine Dorl, and Valerie Bailey-Rihn

The PP&J committee originally shared interest in a drug court evaluation with the CJC. Since the last meeting, Dorl and Bailey-Rihn looked further into state-wide and other drug court evaluations. There are a number of different options for evaluations based on what sort of metrics the CJC is interested in and whether this covers drug treatment courts exclusively or other specialized treatment courts.

Discussion ensued regarding whether a presentation of different treatment courts would be useful.
