AUTHORIZING RECLASSIFICATION OF PROJECT COORDINATOR - PROJECT #3264 to PUBLIC HEALTH SPECIALST IN PUBLIC HEALTH MADISON & DANE COUNTY

Policy Analysis Statement:

Brief Description of Proposal -

Public Health of Madison and Dane County (PHMDC) has requested to reclassify position #3264. This position is currently vacant and classified as a Project Coordinator – Project (P10). Due to changes in the 2020 budget, position #3264 has been reassigned duties that align with the current Public Health Specialist (P7) classification.

Current Policy or Practice -

Reclassifying and combining positions of different classifications requires approval of the County Board.

Impact of Adopting Proposal -

Position #3264 was created to support the Pathways to Recovery Program, which focuses on reducing the burden of substance abuse in Dane County by connecting struggling individuals to assessment and recovery services. Originally, this position was going to specialize in project evaluation, data collection, data analysis and evaluation reporting. However the scope of its duties were altered to better support grant objectives.
