

 - 150,000+ visitors since reopening
















Greatest Accomplishments

- 750,000+ visitors each year (June-August 2020 150,000)
- 2020 Donations on site: \$120,000+
- Education revenue 2019: \$130,000 vs. 2020: \$73,000
- Volunteers have donated 1,100+ hours on grounds= \$28,000 in labor!!! (and used over 27 bottles of bleach solution to sanitize tables)
- Joined Sustain Dane and doing a waste audit and energy audit along with new roofs for the Aviary and

Herpetarium











What is AZA Accreditation?

- ~2800 USDA licensed facilities only 240 are AZA accredited
- Only 4 AZA accredited facilities in Wisconsin
- Only 10 Free AZA zoos in North America
- Accreditation allows us to house Species
 Survival Plan (SSP) Animals such as: Tigers,
 Lions, White Rhino, Red Panda, Polar Bear,
 Orangutans, Lemurs, Gibbons, and more.
- Currently participating in 33 SSP's.
- Community helped each other succeed during COVID-19
