AUTHORIZING ADDING 0.25 FTE USING GRANT FUNDS TO POSITION #3264, PUBLIC HEALTH SPECIALIST – PROJECT MANAGEMENT FOR THE "PATHWAYS TO RECOVERY MADISON & DANE COUNTY" INITIATVE TO COMBAT OPIOID ABUSE

7 The opioid crisis is a public health emergency threatening the wellbeing and lives of individuals 8 who use drugs and impacts communities, first responders, the criminal justice system, child 9 welfare and foster care, and behavioral health systems.

10 To address the crisis, Public Health-Madison and Dane County (PHMDC) will provide their

11 expertise in systems change and as a community convener through the project coordination of

the Department of Justice Comprehensive Opioid Abuse Program (COAP) grant and "Pathways 12

to Recovery Madison & Dane County" initiative, in collaboration with Madison Police 13

14 Department, Dane County Department of Human Services, Madison Fire Department, and the

- University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute. 15
- 16 On January 24, the County Board approved the creation of project position #3264, a 0.75 P10

17 Program Coordinator to lead this work, and the Board approved a reclassification of the position

to a P7 Public Health Specialist - Project Management on August 13, 2020 due to changes in 18

19 the scope of the duties.

20 The reclassification resulted in a reduction in wage rate for the position and savings to the grant. With the budgeted savings, PHMDC proposes funding 0.25 FTE to add to project position 21 #3264, resulting in a 1.0 FTE Public Health Specialist – Project Management position. 22

23 24 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that 0.25 FTE of project position authority is created 25 and combined with position #3264, effective immediately, making position #3264 a project 26 funded 1.0 FTE Public Health Specialist – Project Management position.

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
