## CHANGING THE SIZE OF THE DANE COUNTY BOARD AND DIRECTING THE REDISTRICTING COMMISSION TO DRAW PROPOSED NEW DISTRICT MAPS ACCORDING TO THE NEW BOARD SIZE

5 Federal and state law mandate that every 10 years, after the federal census has been

6 completed, governments are required to go through the redistricting process. This process is

- 7 beginning now due to the 2020 U.S. census.
- 8 Under Wisconsin Statute 59.10, county governments in Wisconsin are required to redistrict
- 9 following the federal decennial census ("decennial redistricting"). At the beginning of the
- 10 decennial redistricting process, counties must first determine the size of the county board and

11 appoint a redistricting commission to draw maps reflecting the selected county board size and

- 12 corresponding districts.
- 13 Size ranges for counties are determined according to population and are governed by
- 14 Wisconsin Statute 59.10. Reducing the size of the county board does nothing to reduce the 15 statutory and constitutional mandates that are placed on counties.
- 16 The county is required to adopt a tentative county supervisory plan within *sixty (60) days* after
- 17 the results of the federal census become available from the federal government or are published
- by a state agency, but no later than July 1, 2021. This process includes the development of a
- 19 proposed county supervisory district plan establishing the number of supervisory districts
- 20 proposed by the board with tentative boundaries for each district and the holding of a public
- 21 hearing on the proposed plan.
- 22 The Executive Committee of the Dane County Board sought public engagement and input over
- the summer regarding the question of whether the size of the Dane County Board shouldchange for purposes of the next redistricting.
- Based on public input and an analysis of issues related to continuing effective representation,
- diversity of representation, access to opportunities for all residents of Dane County to run for
- 27 local office, committee structure, and relative costs to the County Board, the Executive
- 28 Committee determined that a slight reduction in board size from 37 supervisors/supervisory
- 29 districts to 35 supervisors/supervisory districts would maintain the Dane County Board's high
- 30 standard for effective representation of residents.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Dane County Board of Supervisors endorses
- changing the size of the county board from 37 supervisors/supervisory districts to 35
- 33 supervisors/supervisory districts for the 2021 decennial redistricting.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Dane County Board of Supervisors
- directs the 2021 Redistricting Commission to conduct the 2021 redistricting process, including drawing the proposed Dane County Board district maps, based on a County Board size of 35
- 37 supervisors/supervisory districts.
