2020 RES-200 1 CHANGING THE SIZE OF THE DANE COUNTY BOARD AND DIRECTING THE 2 REDISTRICTING COMMISSION TO DRAW PROPOSED NEW DISTRICT MAPS 3 4 ACCORDING TO THE NEW BOARD SIZE Federal and state law mandate that every 10 years, after the federal census has been 5 completed, governments are required to go through the redistricting process. This process is 6 7 beginning now due to the 2020 U.S. census. Under Wisconsin Statute 59.10, county governments in Wisconsin are required to redistrict 8 following the federal decennial census ("decennial redistricting"). At the beginning of the 9 10 decennial redistricting process, counties must first determine the size of the county board and appoint a redistricting commission to draw maps reflecting the selected county board size and 11 12 corresponding districts. Size ranges for counties are determined according to population and are governed by 13 Wisconsin Statute 59.10. Reducing the size of the county board does nothing to reduce the 14 statutory and constitutional mandates that are placed on counties. 15 The county is required to adopt a tentative county supervisory plan within sixty (60) days after 16 the results of the federal census become available from the federal government or are published 17 by a state agency, but no later than July 1, 2021. This process includes the development of a 18 19 proposed county supervisory district plan establishing the number of supervisory districts proposed by the board with tentative boundaries for each district and the holding of a public 20 21 hearing on the proposed plan. The Executive Committee of the Dane County Board sought public engagement and input over 22 23 the summer regarding the question of whether the size of the Dane County Board should change for purposes of the next redistricting. 24 Based on public input and an analysis of issues related to continuing effective representation, 25 diversity of representation, access to opportunities for all residents of Dane County to run for 26 local office, committee structure, and relative costs, to the County Board, the Executive 27 Committee determined that a slight reduction in board size from 37 supervisors/supervisory-28 29 districts to 35-37 supervisors/supervisory districts would maintain the Dane County Board's 30 high standard for effective representation of residents. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Dane County Board of Supervisors endorses 31 changing-maintaining the size of the county board from at 37 supervisors/supervisory districts 32 to 35 supervisors/supervisory districts for the 2021 decennial redistricting. 33 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Dane County Board of Supervisors 34 directs the 2021 Redistricting Commission to conduct the 2021 redistricting process, including 35 drawing the proposed Dane County Board district maps, based on a County Board size of 36

3537 supervisors/supervisory districts.

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
