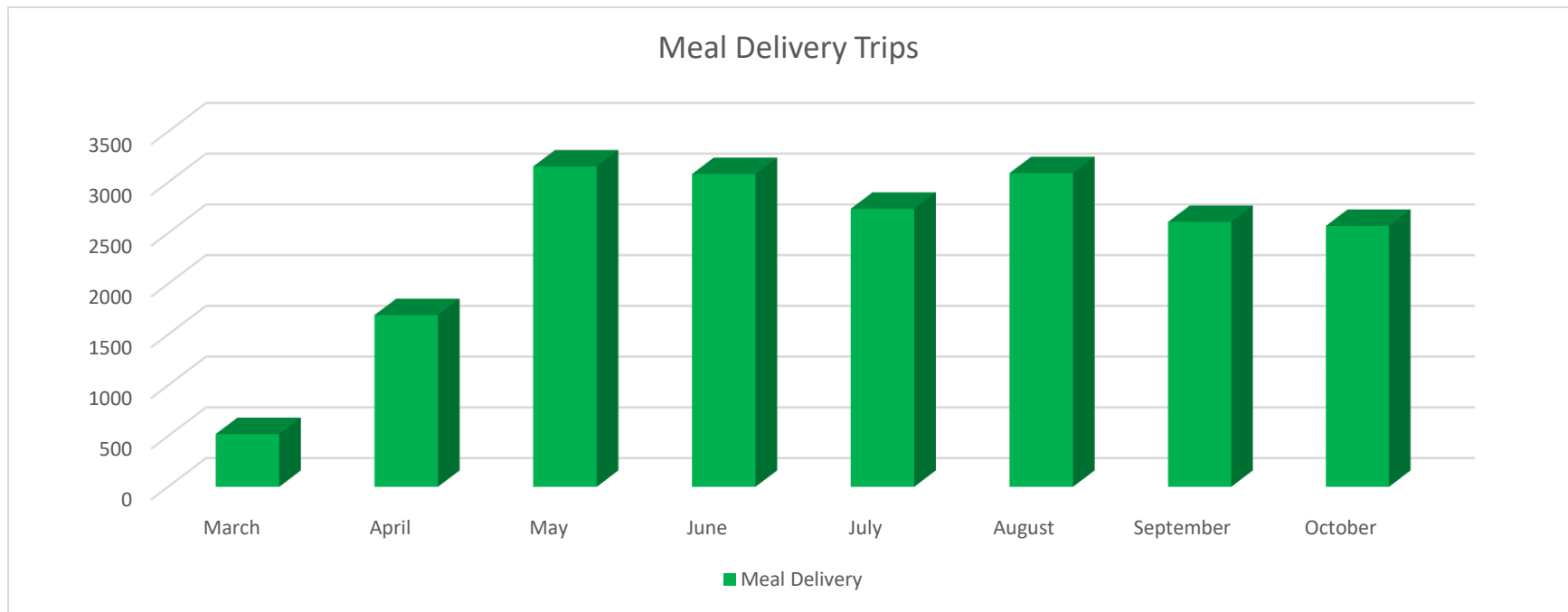
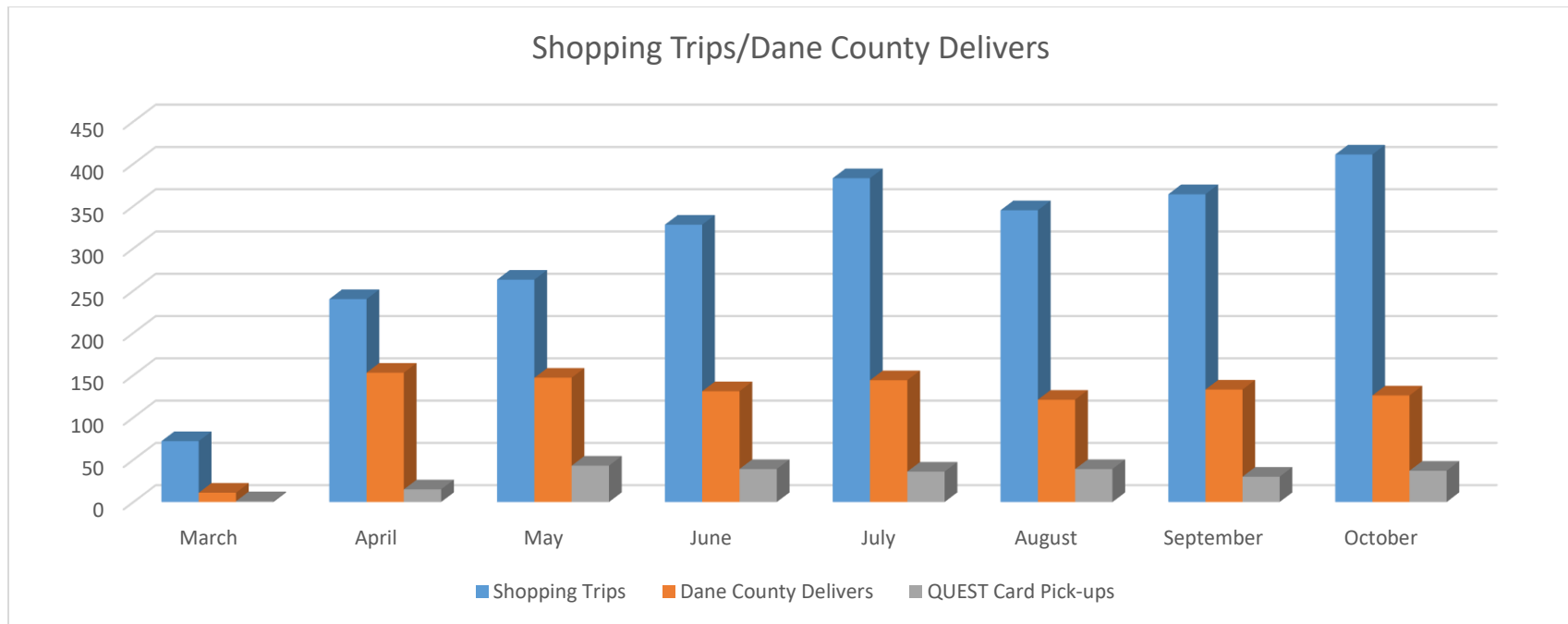


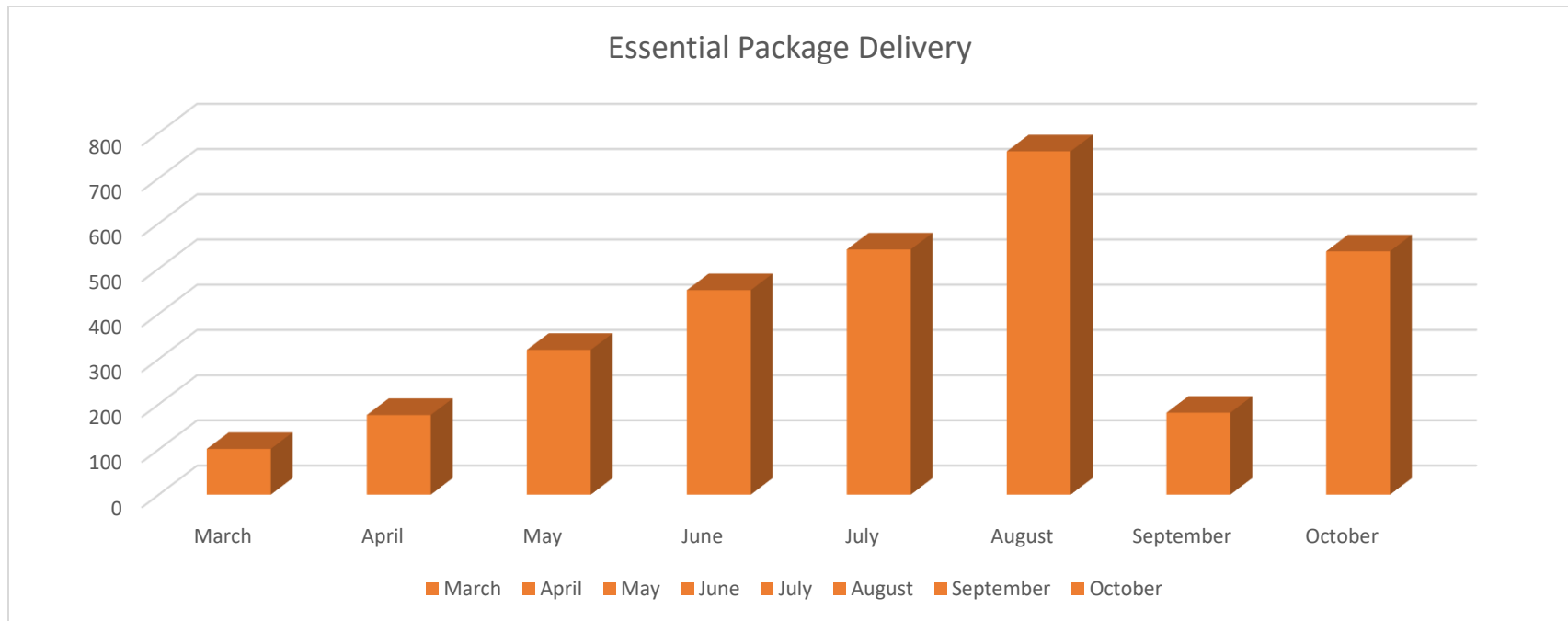
# TRIPS AND TRENDS DURING COVID-19



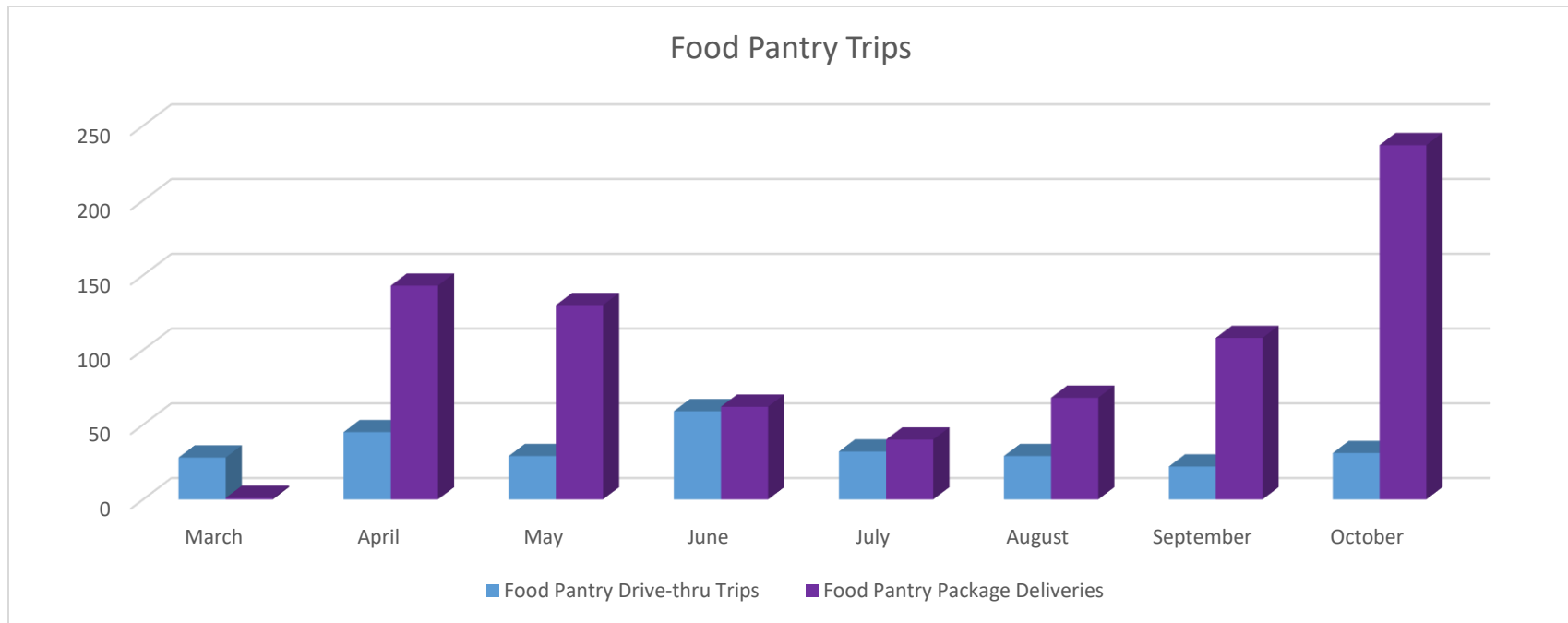
As of October 30, 2020, we have delivered 19,453 meals in Dane County.



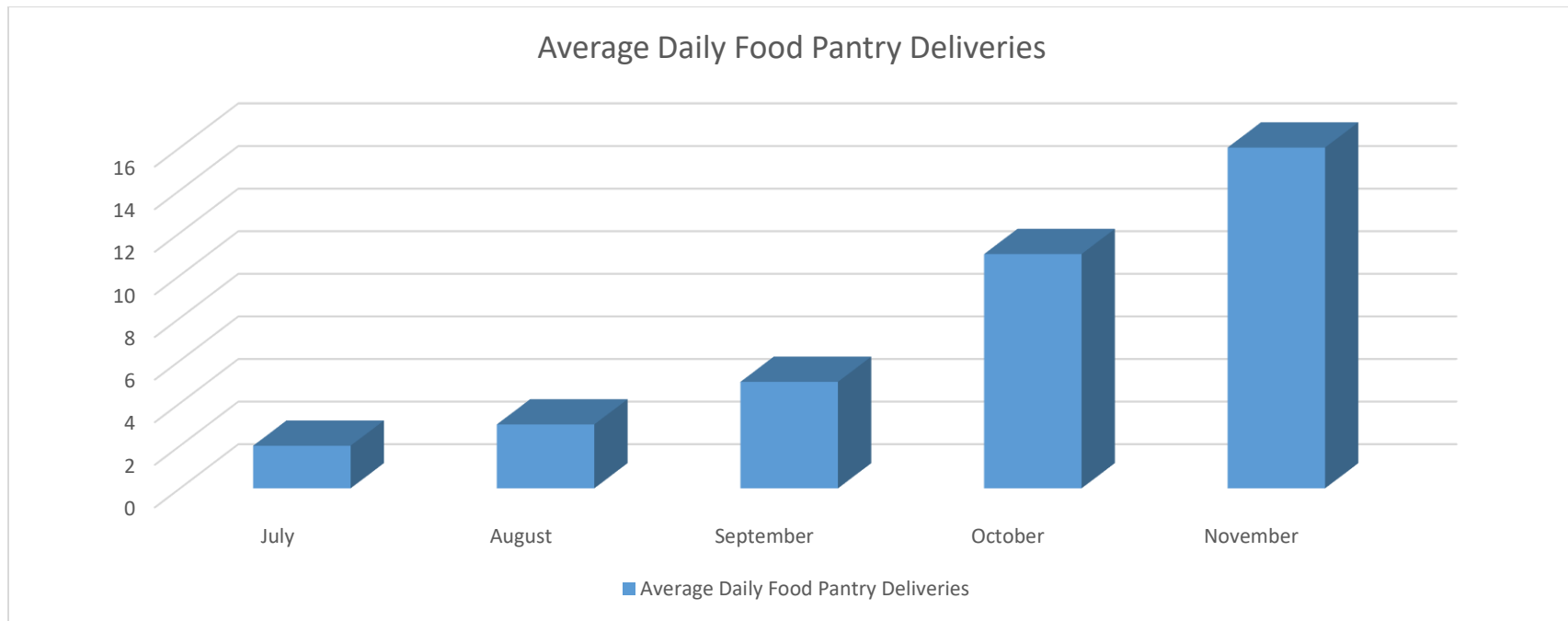
As of October 30, 2020, we have completed 2,406 round-trip (4,816 rides) in-person grocery shopping trips. Dane County Delivers is the program we developed to address the needs of shoppers who did not feel safe going to the store themselves. As of October 30, 2020, we have completed 966 Dane County Delivers trips. Some of the participants use a QUEST card to pay for their groceries. We have completed 240 QUEST card trips. We have delivered approximately \$90,000 worth of groceries as of October 30, 2020 through the Dane County Delivers program.



As of October 30, 2020, we have delivered 3,069 “essential kits.” Most of these kits contain PPE, toiletries, and entertainment materials (like crosswords or the newspaper).



As of October 30, 2020, we have completed 359 drive-thru food pantry trips. We have completed 789 food pantry delivery trips. This amounts to approximately 130,000 pounds of food delivered.



Most of our programs have remained relatively stable, the only exception being the food pantry package deliveries. In July we were averaging just two deliveries a day. As of today, November 6, we are averaging 16 deliveries (over 1,500 pounds of food) a day. This clearly illustrates an increase in food insecurity in Dane County.

This is a typical food pantry delivery for one household.
