Impact of Adopting Proposal - The funds designated for DCDHS will be used to fund a contract with Safe Communities of Madison and Dane County for the assessment and referral to treatment for all those who are referred to the program. The contract will also provide for the Peer Specialists to be deployed on the Addiction Resource Team together with an Addiction Resource Officer from MPD and Community Paramedic. The Addiction Resource Team is a major component of the project goals of promoting recovery, enhancing public safety and reducing the rate of opioid fatalities. The Addiction Resource Team will focus on delivering a harm reduction message, including the distribution of naloxone, to individuals through a combination of pre-arrest diversion, outreach, and overdose response. The team will also provide a direct link to assessment and treatment referral for those struggling with substance use disorders.
