## 3. Selection of Committee Chair

Voss motioned to nominate Dan Brown as Chair of the Committee, seconded by Hampton. Voss moved to close nominations, seconded by Hampton. A motion was made by Voss, seconded by Hampton to approve Brown as Chair (5-0).

## 5. Confirm Negotiations May Legally Begin

Reviewed letter from Waste Facility Siting Board stating that negotiations may legally begin, dated November 4, 2020.

## 6. Confirm Meeting Was Properly Noticed

Reviewed County meeting notice. Meeting was properly noticed.

## 7. Review Legal Role of the Committee

Welch provided overview of the legal role of the Committee and the applicable State Statutes (ss. 289.33). Explained what may legally be negotiated and arbitrated.

## 8. Review Proposed Landfill Expansion Plan

Welch presented information on the proposed landfill expansion, including footprint of vertical expansion, estimated additional site life, height, stormwater management, operations, and screening.

There was a question about plans for the use of County land off of Luds Lane. Welch stated that 20-25 acres would remain in County control for future County uses, but the remaining acres would be developed into a large solar field per an Agreement between Dane County and Alliant Energy.

## 9. Discuss a Framework for Negotiations

Committee members agreed to use the existing agreement as a framework for negotiations.

## 11. Discuss Negotiating Items

City of Madison had no items to discuss regarding Agreement revisions.

Town of Cottage Grove concerns include: odor management, loss of sunlight, payments to adjacent property owners, and post-closure activities at landfill.

#### **Revisions to Article III:**

•Section E: Dane County would like to have the ability to operate the landfill starting at 5:00 AM Monday through Saturday with Waste Acceptance starting at 6:00 AM Monday through Saturday.

 Section F: There was a request to discuss the reporting process for odor complaints and subsequent investigation.

#### **Revisions to Article V:**

- •Section D: Height limitations to be revised to account for vertical expansion.
- •Section E: Better define "other waste processing operations" (Subsection 4).

#### Revisions to Article VI:

- •Method of calculating CPI (Milwaukee CPI is outdated).
- •Section A: Parties to discuss the need, if any, for revisions to compensation area and associated compensation classes.
- Section B: Parties to discuss if Group A+ should be eligible for retroactive payments.

It was noted that the Town of Blooming Grove would be annexed into the City of Madison this December. City of Madison to be involved in compensation discussions.

The Committee did not move into closed session.

## 14. Discuss Negotiating Items

Committee members agreed that staff and attorneys should meet to discuss compensation. Following those discussions, staff will present findings and options to the Committee for their review and approval.

Dane County would need to have the Agreement finalized by August 2021 to meet WDNR timeline.

The next Committee meeting will be in early February. A staff and attorney level discussion will be held in early January to review redlines and discuss compensation.
