2. Cross Country Skiing and New Groomer

Stinson provided a video of the County's trail groomer and new grooming equipment. The social media video was created to show the new trail equipment and how it's used, but it also explained why trails are groomed, how permit fees offset the operations costs and who can use the designated ski trails. Stinson gave a shout-out to the Friends of McCarthy Park for their ski trails and volunteer efforts. Stinson also shared pictures of winter ski trail use around the park system.

3. Fire Department Training Burn - Cherokee Marsh WA

Stinson and Schwab discussed a training burn led by the Village of Waunakee Fire Department. Stinson outlined the steps staff took to prepare for the training exercise including photos and a video that was taken by a neighbor. Stinson pointed out that Schwab served two roles with the project. As the Parks Operations Manager he worked with planning staff to prepare for the project, and as a Lieutenant on the Waunakee Fire Department helping run the training program. Several other area fire departments participated in the training exercises. Schwab showed interior pictures of the house while it was on fire, the smoke and buildup of gas, the view a fire fighter sees as they enter a home, and the safe zone near the floor. Stinson and Schwab also discussed the permitting process for these activities, the testing and removal of hazardous materials, and the recycling process.
