Work Groups

1. Food Access, Relief & Economic Support

Held an ad hoc Community Food Access (CFA) Grant Review meeting on Feb 22 with FARES WG members that did not have any conflicts of interest.

2. Food Systems Recovery & Resilience

Held an ad hoc CFA Grant Review meeting on Feb 24 with FSR2 WG members that did not have any conflicts of interest.

3. Regional Agriculture & Food Sovereignty

Met on 2/19 to continue discussion on city and county land for potential ag use or adjustment of ag lease practices. Also had a discussion focused on farm to institution purchasing with guests from Department of Ag & Consumer Protection, REAP Food Group, and UW Center for Integrated Ag Systems. Next meeting is Fri 3/19, 12-1:30pm. Held an ad hoc CFA Grant Review meeting on Feb 26 with RAFS WG members that did not have any conflicts of interest

City of Madison — George Reistad

Completed deliberations on Community Food Access Grants and Go-oh Groceries Healthy Retail Access Program Grant application. CFA Grants Funding Recommendation: 12 applications for \$150,000. Go-oh Groceries HRAP Proposal Funding Recommendation: Healthy Retail Access Work Group recommends fully funding application for \$125,000.

Public Health Madison & Dane County — Nick Heckman
The Pavilion at Alliant Energy Center is now handling all PHMDC vaccinations. COVID-19
testing has moved to the Coliseum building.

20% of Dane County has received at least one COVID vaccination. 70% of seniors age 65+ have received vaccines. Percent of positive tests in Dane County has dropped to 0.8%.

Employer-provided vaccines for public-facing essential workers in the food supply chain will be provided in the coming weeks. For now, all individuals in this group are eligible for vaccines at retail pharmacies (which are taking all Tier 1B eligible groups at once rather than in sequence).

Exploring opportunities for FEMA reimbursement to restaurants and food businesses through a recent Biden executive order which makes expenses for hunger prevention a reimbursable expense.

Working with school districts to understand Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P—EBT) benefits and how families may benefit from this program, including retroactive payments to low-income families that fed children at home.

Dane County — Jess Guffey Calkins

2021 Partners in Equity (PIE) Food Project Grants: \$19,500 is available for disbursement (\$5,000 for the <\$2K application category; \$14,500 for the \$2K-\$4K application category). 31 applications were received, requesting a total of \$95,515 (small grant total application request: \$15,824; larger grant total application request: \$73,691). Pending contracts, 9 grants will be awarded: 4 in the small grant category, 5 in the larger grant category.

Dane County Food Council is able to fund FairShare Partner Shares program at \$60K in

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2021, as in 2020 (regular yearly funding amount is \$15K).

Community Gardens

Community garden organizers continue to work to ensure everyone can register for a garden plot that wants one, using many different methods of outreach and registration. Gardens Network staff are helping with this and also working with City of Madison staff to update leases to allow for garden expansion. We also finished our first ever Wisconsin-wide community garden conference, in collaboration with garden groups in Green Bay and Milwaukee, which was pretty successful.

Madison Metropolitan School District

MMSD Food & Nutrition On March 8, MMSD began the phased reopening of schools. We will continue to offer our virtual meal boxes to families that have students not attending school in person. More information can be found on our website at https://food.madison.k12.wi.us/

MMSD will also have meal boxes available for pickup during spring break on Tuesday, March 30 only.
