Smith provided information on the purchase of commercial lands immediately adjacent to the LWRD Robertson Road Facility. Smith indicated that there were additional monies in the resolution to create interconnectivity between facilities and traffic flow, security, fencing gates and cameras, work on the larger parking areas to improve stormwater management and some minor updates to the garage building.

 - 1. North Mendota Trail

James provided an update on the status of the development of the North Mendota Trail from North Shore Bay Drive through Governor Nelson State Park to the underpass on CTH M. James stated that Dane County Highway was planning on building the new trail section this spring, but an environmental survey of the site indicated that there was the potential of impacting nesting areas of a threatened bird species in Wisconsin that may postpone the construction start until fall of 2021. Planning for development of the remaining trail between the North Mendota Wildlife Area Prairie Unit and the City of Middleton is also anticipated to begin in the fall of 2021.

2. Visitor Services Program

Pascual provided a summary of a new program that Parks and LWRD are working on that will bring existing staff together to support a new program within Parks called Visitor Services. The program will also support LWRD. There is a need to create a resource pool of staff to help provide guidance for three major areas, Public Engagement, Volunteers, and Educational Programs that include the following. Focusing on Park Rangers and direct park services; community engagement through web, print, social media, media, press releases, newsletters, park kiosks and special events; Educational programming to include the goals, vision and mission of LWRD through the Dane County Parks and Open Space Plan and its Land and Water Resource Plan; Volunteer program supporting over 3,000 volunteers and 65,000 hours annually to support our park lands; Lussier Family Heritage Center as a resource center and educational training facility.
