Green Industry Professionals

- **Urban Forestry Program**
 - Continuing education for arborists primarily
 - Online in fall 2020, collaboration with colleagues from four other counties, average of 55 attended per each of 3 sessions
 "As a City forester, I will utilize the handouts and publication links in decisions made concerning trees selected for planting in our city."
- Winter Seminar Series (aka Landscape and Grounds) Maintenance Short Course in 2021)
 - Held online in February 2021, collaboration with colleagues from three other counties over 4 weeks
 262 to 297 attendees participated each of the 4 weeks
 Brought in local speakers and some from other states

 - Provides continuing education for green industry Over 67% said they learned 'a great deal' or 'a lot' the top two Likert
 - scale measurements
 - "I am new to the landscaping business and am grateful for the overview of so many things that are a part of the job."

Green Thumb Gardening Classes

- In-person fall classes prior to 2020 Switch to on-line classes in 2020 increased average
 - attendance from in-person five- to seven-fold Winter Vegetable Gardening Series

 - 6 classes, average attendance about 60
 - Green Thumb Gardening classes now run all year long Plan to have blended online and in-person in the future post-pandemic

Habitat for Humanity

Gave a required attendance talk in fall 2020 and spring 2021 on caring for landscapes and home maintenance (snow shoveling, gutter care) for diverse new home owners groups

 - Joined with colleague Jess Calkins, non-profit Rooted (through Dane Gardens Network), Groundwork Milwaukee and a colleague from Brown County to hold online.
 - Attendees from at least 6 counties
