Emergency Food System



Second Harvest program extended through July 2022

Partnered with The Hmong Institute to hold an info session (with translation) for Hmong growers interested in selling to Second Harvest.

Food pantries

- During the pandemic, switched to outdoor, curbside, boxed pick-ups.
- Many pantries built outdoor structures/awnings for operating in the winter months.
- Pantries are working to provide more market-style choice-based model
- More volunteers re-engaging as they get vaccinated.

School Nutrition



Free school meals extended through 2021-2022 school year (7 days/week)

Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT)

MMSD: Current Meal Box distribution covers 7 days

- Distributing 1 day/week
- 16 school & neighborhood food pick-up sites
- Includes evening pick up sites

Summer feeding program

- 24 sites identified;
- Hoping to offer Market Box Model through summer as well

Community Supported Food Security Programs



Restaurant-led meal prep & delivery to residents with food access barriers

Cook It Forward, FEED To Go (FEED Kitchens), Little John's (\$5/meal)

Dane County PIE Grants / City of Madison Community Food Access Grants

- 53 applications (31 applied to PIE, 43 applied to CFA 19 of those applied to both)
- \$19.5K funded to PIE applicants (requests totaled \$95K); \$150K funded to CFA applicants (requests totaled \$834K)

Farms to Families Program (REAP Food Group & Root4Change)

- Focus is Madison-area Latinx and indigenous residents
- Winding down at the end of May due to infrastructure & capacity limitations

Medical Community: Championing Medically Tailored Meals / Meal Kits

Current Nutrition Incentive Programs in Dane County



Changes to the SNAP Program

- Online shopping with SNAP benefits available for the first time
- 15% Increases in SNAP benefits through Sept 2021 (impacts ~50K Dane residents)

Double Dollars available for FoodShare (WI SNAP) participants

- Up to \$25 match per market day at participating farmers' markets (June-Sept 2021)
- Up to \$20 match at Willy Street Co-op locations during non-market months
- 2021 funding compromised due to suspension on reusable bags

Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program vouchers for seniors 60+

\$25 voucher for produce or herbs at WI farmers' markets/farm stands (June-Oct 2021)

WIC Farmers' Market Program

\$30 voucher for WIC families to purchase fresh produce at markets/farm stands
