
Current Order

Order #16 went into effect today and is in place until June 2 at 12:01am.

- Increases gathering limits indoors (350 or less with food and drink; 500 people or less without food and drink)
- Increases capacity limit for businesses to 75% (includes restaurants and taverns)
- Physical distancing at gatherings, restaurants, and taverns required except when in transit




COVID-19 Vaccine

As of May 3:


South Madison test site: 12,215 tested

Alliant test site: 417,519 tested




COVID-19 Testing at Alliant

There were about 42,000 fewer tests last month at Alliant Energy Center than at the peak in October.




COVID-19 Testing at South Madison


There were about 2,500 fewer tests last month at our South Madison Office than at the peak in November.



The last time we met, our 14-day averages looked like this:




Our current 14-day average




Hospitalizations

Pop-up clinics starting next week




Looking Ahead
