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AUTHORIZING GRANT FUNDING FROM THE OFFICE OF NATIONAL DRUG CONTROL POLICY, MILWAUKEE HIGH INTENSITY DRUG TRAFFICKING AREA (HIDTA), GRANT G21ML0014A

The Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) provides funding to law enforcement agencies to participate in the HIDTA Program. The HIDTA Program, created by Congress with the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, provides assistance to federal, state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies that operate in areas determined to be critical drug-trafficking regions of the United States. This resolution authorizes acceptance of HIDTA Grant funding to reimburse the Sheriff's Office for criminal investigations involving drug trafficking organizations and money laundering organizations to reduce drug trafficking and drug production in the region.

The HIDTA Grant, G21ML0014A, period of performance is 1/1/2021 - 12/31/2022 (twoyears) and total revenue of \$150,000, shall be reimbursed quarterly upon submission of approved reimbursable claims to the Milwaukee HIDTA. This grant shall also support retirement and social security costs for the Anti-Heroin and the Anti-Methamphetamine Task Force Grants for an estimate amount of \$5,300.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sheriff's Office is hereby authorized to accept ONDCP funding administered by the Milwaukee HIDTA, in the amount of \$150,000; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$150,000 is set up as revenue in the Sheriff's Office, Field Services, Drug Enforcement HIDTA Grant Revenue (SHRFFLD 80726) account line and is credited to the General Fund; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that \$150,000 is transferred from the General Fund to the following Sheriff's Office account lines:

A. General Terms and Conditions

The HIDTA PPBG is issued pursuant to authority granted the Director of ONDCP by the SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act (21 U.S.C. § 1706) and the Uniform Administration Requirements (2 C.F.R. § 200) which provide the Director of ONDCP authority to coordinate funds and implement oversight and management function with respect to the HIDTA Program. D. Federal Award Performance Goals

Requests for payment in the DPM system will not be approved unless the required disbursements have been entered using the corresponding object class designations. Payments will be made via Electronic Fund Transfer to the award recipient's bank account. The bank must be Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured. The account must be interest bearing.
- 3.
