## The nonprofit sector

- ▶ There are 2,815 nonprofit organizations operating in Dane County registered with the IRS as of 2017.
- ▶ There are 4,685 organizations in all 501c categories in Dane County, registered with the IRS as of 2017.
- ▶ Categories: Human Services (29%), Education (14%), Public, Societal benefit (13%), Religion related (11%), Arts, Culture, and Humanities (11%), Health (8%), Environment (6%), Unclassified, International, Mutual aid (9%)
- ▶ Employer of choice for many
- ▶ Economic development due to revenue generation and circulation

## Society as a four legged stool



- ▶ Nonprofit sector plays critical role in addressing societal challenges.
- ▶ Questions driving the project:
  - ▶ How are nonprofits themselves sustained?
  - ▶ How can we increase the capacity of the sector?
  - ▶ For Extension, how can we best support the essential work done by nonprofit organizations?

## NONPROFIT CAPACITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT

## PEER LEARNING

**Recommendation: Develop and sustain robust peer cohort learning and longer time-frame professional development opportunities based here in Dane County.**

"There's a bounty of knowledge locked up in other executive director heads."

## INFORMATION SHARING

**Recommendation: Establish and sustain a local nonprofit center or hub of practical information about what's going on in the nonprofit sector that is up-to-date and easy to use.**

"I assumed when I moved here that there was a nonprofit resource center. Having somewhere that could at least coordinate some of these resources would help. There are always things that I don't know about that are going on in Madison and resources we may not know about."

## RACIAL EQUITY

**Recommendation: Fund and support organizations led by people of color working on equity and assist white-led organizations in deeper transformations towards racial equity.**

"Many women and men of color are being used and abused in nonprofit industries."

"Traditional environmental organizations have got to do the deep work of racial justice. ... Is this environment safe for folks to feel like they belong?"

## COLLABORATION

**Recommendation: Fund and support equitable collaboration and coalition-building around shared goals with a focus on nurturing existing relationships**

**51%** of respondents to a post session evaluation said the most important take-away from their conversation related to how satisfying and meaningful it was to connect with other nonprofit leaders.

## EVALUATION AND DATA MANAGEMENT

**Recommendation: Fund and support meaningful and equitable evaluation and impact assessment that is most useful and relevant to those closest to the work.**

"...appreciated discussion of potential funding stream to help nonprofit assess strengths/opportunities."

\*\* There is a strong desire among nonprofits to understand the impact of their work and find ways to improve or innovate.

## KEY RECOMMENDATION

- ▶ Fund capacity building to improve the strength and reach of the nonprofit sector
  - ▶ Funders:
    - ▶ Prioritize capacity building > the infrastructure
    - ▶ Develop collaborations and mechanisms to assure equity in capacity building funding allocations
  - ▶ Nonprofit support organizations:
    - ▶ Collaborate to build innovative training programs
    - ▶ Provide opportunities for networking
    - ▶ Serve as a convener for collaborations and provide backbone support functions
