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AUTHORIZING NEW HOUSING PROGRAM SPECIALIST PROJECT POSITION DCDHS - HAA DIVISION

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This project is funded with the County's allocation of local aid authorized in the 2021 American Rescue Plan. Therefore, this resolution follows the format outlined in 2021 RES-013.

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<u>Justification</u>

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Authorizing Law: In March of 2021, the federal government authorized the \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan (ARP) stimulus bill authorizing additional funding to respond to and recover from the COVID-19 pandemic across multiple areas of need.

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Dane County was allocated over \$106 million in ARP local aid. A portion of those funds has been committed to various efforts to prevent and end homelessness and limit spread of COVID-19 through efforts to provide social distancing in the congregate shelter system.

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Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic: The Dane County Department of Human Services (DCDHS) continues to play a substantial role in Dane County's ongoing response to and recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. The DCDHS' Housing Access and Affordability Division (HAA) has administered multiple emergency response programs providing non-congregate shelter to prevent exposure to and spread of COVID-19 among households experiencing homelessness, eviction prevention and rental assistance, small business assistance, and more.

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Beginning in March of 2020, Dane County funded non-congregate hotel shelter operations and assisted with other congregate shelter expansions to quickly create critical social distancing in the community's homeless shelter system. The rapid emergence of the COVID-19 Delta variant necessitates an extension of these efforts, and continued collaborative partnerships with the City of Madison, Public Health Madison-Dane County, and frontline agencies to address other emerging issues related to safe sheltering.

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Additional staff capacity is required in the HAA Division to monitor these contracts and manage Dane County's responsibilities related to congregate and non-congregate sheltering. An additional 1.0 FTE Project Housing Program Specialist will be required.

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<u>Duplication of Funding/Existing Partnerships and Programs:</u> The funding is cooperative with other project staff positions, as additional capacity is needed to manage ongoing sheltering efforts.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that position authority in the Human Services Department is increased by 1.0 FTE, effective 10/01/2021 so as to add 1.0 FTE Project Housing Program Specialist (P10) within the HAA Division of the Department of Human Services, payroll org 6080; and,
