## City-County Building - Room 354

A quorum of the Executive Committee was not present. Members of the LWC Stormwater technical advisory committee convened with members of the CARPC technical advisory committee and discussed the following next steps and priorities:

- •Will work with county staff to identify potential projects for pilot trading programs. Pilot projects, would ideally include at least one redevelopment project and one working with a private developer. These pilots would help the TAC gain a better understanding of how a trading program would work locally and provide a better understanding of volume control and costs. A more comprehensive study of the range of practices, costs, and potential for reductions could also be done to understand what amount of credits will be needed to meet the end goal.
- •Plan to continue looking for examples of innovative stormwater management practices and would like to research other outdated building, plumbing and zoning codes that could be preventing low-cost, simple practices from being implemented.
- •Need to determine the appropriate entity to implement and manage a trading system.
- •There are many large redevelopment projects in the works or planned for the future that could be approached about the possibility of a pilot, including: Promega, Oscar Mayer, Alliant Energy Center, the Messner project, etc.
- •The time it takes water to get from Mendota to the Rock River is very long. Is there a way to remove resistance or use dams more effectively?
